MARKHAM—

Following a series of intense negotiations and utilization of an Ontario Government conciliation officer, Markham Hydro has reached an agreement on a first contract with its outside employees, members of Local 636, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. The pact is for three years.

The agreement, ratified by members March 18, provides for a five per cent increase effective July 1, 1984; a 3.7% increase effective July 1, 1985 and a further 3.6% increase on July 1, 1986.
