

Full-service restaurants

McDonald's Restaurants of Canada has moved to meet the motoring public by opening the first of four full-service restaurants in Gulf Canada stations on major Ontario highways.

The first store, owned and operated by John Darrin, a McDonald's franchisee, was officially opened on Highway 400 on February 10, and like every other McDonald's restaurant throughout the world, offers the complete range of meals, along with McDonald's famous Quality Service, Cleanliness and Value.

"McDonald's has always located where people are," said George Cohon, President and Chief Executive Officer of McDonald's. "By joining with Gulf Canada to locate new restaurants on major highways, we are striving to meet the challenge of the future by meeting the needs of today's travellers."

Future restaurants will open in Gulf Canada Limited stations at West Lorne on Highway 401 just west of London approximately March 30, and to coincide with the opening of the main tourist season, at Cookstown south of Barrie on Highway 400 and at Trenton on Highway 401. Gulf is also making extensive renovations to upgrade its facilities at each location.

McDonald's continues to expand into unique, imaginative areas. Mr. Cohon said, pointing to previous openings of stores in the Metro Toronto Zoo, Montreal's La Ronde (former site of EXPO 67), and Canadian Forces Base Borden at Angus, Ontario.

Ranked No. 1 in the fast food industry, McDonald's serves an average of 1.5 million Canadians per day. Its industry-setting quality standard have remained consistently high during the organization's growth and expansion.

Plan photo licences

Lost your licence and afraid someone else will use it? Soon, there'll soon be no need to panic, unless you have a look-alike.

Beginning Jan. 1, 1986, Ontario will be phasing in a new photo licence system.

After considerable study involving a look at other jurisdictions, it was felt this would help make roads safer and provide police with reliable means for proper identification.

Under the present system, police have no way of making sure a stopped driver is the holder of that particular licence. In addition, photo driver licences will prevent experienced drivers from substituting for inexperienced drivers during driver exams.

The new licence will consist of two parts. One will show

the driver's photo and the second will contain information similar to that of existing licences. There'll be control numbers on each part to make sure they match up.

Once in place, the photo and document parts will be re-

newed as part of the three-year renewal cycle, or can be replaced if a person's name is changed.

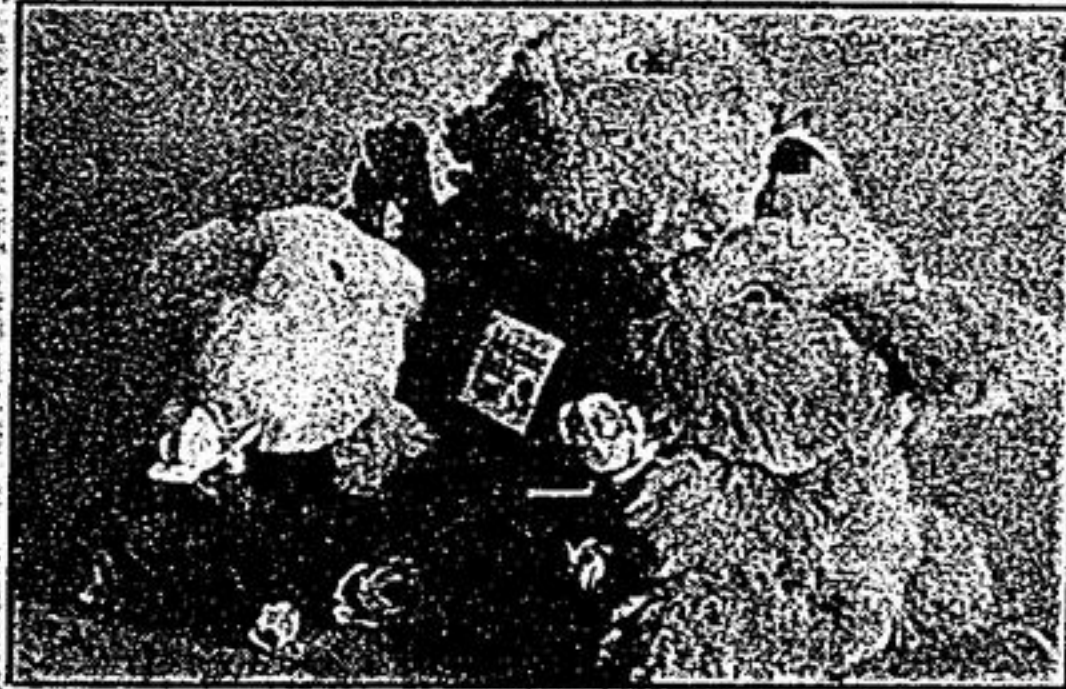
Camera equipment will be installed in Ministry driver examination centres and motor vehicle issuing agencies across the province.

It will take three years to completely phase in the new system.

Ontario will join British Columbia, Alberta and Prince Edward Island, as well as 50 jurisdictions in the United States with similar systems.
