

Election results-1981

YORK NORTH. The last provincial election was held March 19, 1981. Who were the party candidates and what was the result?

In the Riding of York North, M.P.P. Bill Hodgson of R.R. 1, Kettleby carried the banner for the Progressive Conservatives; Jim Wilson of Newmarket represented the Liberals and Keith Munro of Aurora was the choice of the N.D.P.

Bill Hodgson was re-elected with 18,405 votes, 8,189 more than Wilson with 10,216. Munro ran third with 4,614.

Bill Hodgson gained 55.4 per cent of the popular vote.

In York Centre, Alf Stong, (Liberal), of Richmond Hill, lost out to Don Cousens (Progressive Conservative) of Markham by 1,722 votes. It was 19,094 for Cousens, 17,372 for Stong and 3,701 for John Campey (N.D.P.), of Gormley.

In Durham-York, Ross Stevenson, (Progressive Conservative), R.R. 2, Sunderland, handily defeated Gary Adam-

son, (Liberal), of Markham and Margaret Wilbur, (N.D.P.), of R.R. 4, Port Perry. It was 14,404 for Stevenson; 6,330 for Adamson and 4,314 for Wilbur.

In the Riding of Durham West, George Ashe, (Progressive Conservative), of Pickering, easily defeated Norman Wei, (Liberal), also of Pickering, 17,029 to 7,446. Hugh Peacock, (N.D.P.), of Whitby and Bill Leslie, (Libertarian), of Pickering, ran third and fourth respectively. Peacock garnered 6,578 votes and Leslie, 1,215.
