UXBRIDGE — It was hard to imagine a more fitting conclusion to Uxbridge Figure Skating Club's 1985 season.

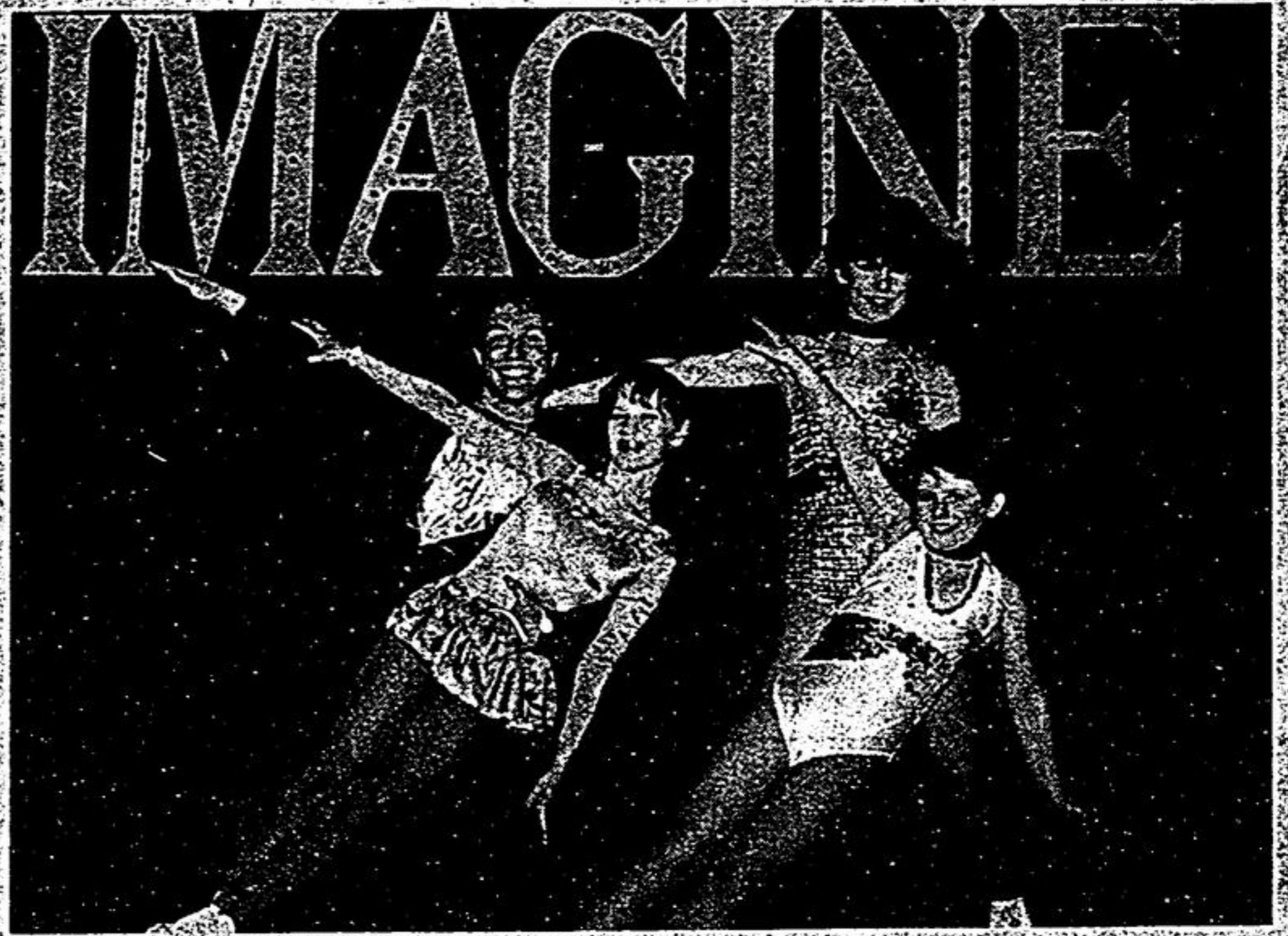
The club presented an elaborate ice fantasy entitled 'Imagination' before three large and appreciative weekend audiences.
