

Student awarded compensation

WHITCHURCH — On May 11, 1984, two students of Stouffville Dist. Secondary School were involved in an altercation at the S.D.S.S. May Prom.

Charged with assault was Bryan Todd, then 19, of R.R. 4, Stouffville. The complainant was Allan Emby, also 19, of R.R. 3, Stouffville.

Todd was subsequently convicted by Judge Bernard Kelly, and given a conditional discharge. He was ordered to make restitution to the Emby family for uninsured medical expenses.

This week Mr Emby, a student attending Wilfrid Laurier University at Waterloo, reported the decision of the Criminal Compensation Board, following a hearing, May 2. He said he'd been awarded \$1,900 for pain and suffering related to injury to his eye.

Planning application

Convenience store at vacant Lake site

MUSS LAKE — A Toronto couple plans to operate a modern convenience outlet at the former Sun Valley store, Ninth Line and Mitchell Avenue.

Sok Ran and Man-Chun You, who formerly ran a similar shop in the city, presented their plans before the Town's planning advisory committee, May 7.

The property is presently an eyesore and needs to be cleaned up, committee members were told.

They want to operate the convenience store in the larger existing structure. Future plans include establishment of a snack bar and possibly a post office to serve the lake community.

The proposal has been referred to Town Planner Michael Saunders for comment.

Building lots

The Town's planning advisory committee rejected a proposed estate residential plan on a Whitchurch-Stouffville property, then supported the establishment of three new 10-acre building lots there.

Robert Portar's subject lands on Conc. 9 with frontage on the Aurora Road.

Two estate developments

WHITCHURCH — Two estate subdivisions are planned for the area of Conc. 6 and the Aurora Sideroad, Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The one is on property owned by James Sabiston. It includes 248 acres and will contain 119 building lots.

The other is known as Sohrab Developments. It includes 37 acres and will contain 10 building lots.

Both have been approved by Council. The Sabiston development will be phased over five years.
