## Johnston top rider

Dale Johnston, a 21-year-old Ringwood resident, has been riding his motorcross bike competitively for only three years.

But, his performances on the Ontario motorcross circuit have put him in first

place in the junior loop after the first four races.

However, unlike his first two years, this time around, Johnston has a sponsor.

"We feel Dale is an up-and-coming rider," says Gary

Pike, the manager of Markham Honda, Johnston's sponsor.

"Dale right now is sitting in the top three or four in Canada," Pike said.

Johnston's sponsorship includes discounts on parts, bikes, service as well as moral support on race days.

"They're really interested in the sport," Johnston says of his sponsors. "Everything's worked out well."

Like most young children, Dale's attraction to motorcycles began when he was growing up. "My parents bought me a mini-bike," he said.

But little did his parents know that eventually their son would race competitively. "My mom doesn't go (to events) because she's afraid," says Johnston. "But, it's only as dangerous as the guy on the bike."

The third-annual Stouffville Raiders slo-pitch tournament is all set for this Victoria Day long-weekend. All that organizer Paul Murray is hoping for now is cooperation from Mother Nature. "I can only hope we have good weather," said Murray. "We don't want to get wiped out by rain."

"I shot for 16, but I got eight," said Murray of his efforts to attract the ladies. "But I can't really argue with that."

All of the teams continued with their exhibition schedules on the weekend.
