Issues interest Twp. Mayor

UXBRIDGE — Some recent controversial issues pertaining to municipal politics have attracted the interest of Uxbridge Twp. Mayor Bill Ballinger.

Among these is the Supreme Court of Ontario decision awarding over \$7-million in damages to a boy injured in a 1977 motorcycle on City of Brampton parkland.

One of the defendants in the case was the Corporation of the City of Brampton.

"From every corporation's point of view, it's an eyeopener," Mayor

Ballinger told The Tribune.

He said that legal decision, now under appeal, will be kept in mind during Uxbridge Township's annual review of its insurance coverage.


Conflict of interest policy is another area that's been in the news, after North York Controller Andrew Borins lost his seat last month for not disclosing a direct financial interest in a multi-million dollar land deal. He'd voted on it back in 1983.

Mayor Ballinger said he supports the declaration of a conflict of interest from

his councillors, no matter how remote the connection. The circumstances here are quite different than in a larger urban municipality, he added.

Library A restoration project at Uxbridge Public Library will soon begin with the aid of a \$40,000 Heritage Ontario grant, to be matched equally by Uxbridge Twp.

The Township has also made application for Ministry of Citizenship and Culture funding for Uxbridge's library addition. A total of \$30-million is offered to Ontario communities.



Stallion makes debut at Uxbridge farm

A consortium, based at Uxbridge's Red Fox Breeding Farm, recently purchased a three-year-old Hannoverian stallion. Majority owner-trainer Marie-Louise Roth-Fuchs displayed the horse, named 'Lucid',

during a special presentation, Saturday. The stallion is being used to breed sport horses for dressage, jumping and three-day eventing.

Association ready for pulls

UXBRIDGE — The Uxbridge Tractor Pull Association elected its 1985 executive at a meeting, April 11.

Glen James is president while Brian Dick will serve as vice-president and Judy Dick, secretary/treasurer.

Directors, each responsible for a designated job area during the annual pull, are: Steven Taylor, Howie Herrema, Wayne Kennedy, Norm James, Elaine Cox, Sandy Ewen, Karen Smith and Dale Ashton.

The Uxbridge Tractor Pull will be held on Friday, Aug. 23 and Saturday, Aug. 24, beginning at 7 p.m. The event features 13 classes, including modified two-wheel drive trucks, highway tractors, two classes of modified tractors, as well as stock and pro-stock tractor divisions.

The admission price is \$4 per adult with children under 12 admitted free when accompanied by an adult.

The Uxbridge association is a non-profit organization that donates all profits back into projects throughout Uxbridge Township.

Donations from a very successful 1984 season totalled approximately \$6,000. The money was distributed as follows: \$1,500 to the Uxbridge Township Library Fund; \$500 to the Music Hall Lighting Fund; \$500

each to Sandford, Zephyr and Leaskdale Playground Funds; and \$500 to the Cottage Hospital Trauma Centre. Also funded by these proceeds was upgrading work at Elgin Park including new lighting and fencing, plus installation of a set of portable bleachers.

The 1985 circuit gets underway Saturday May 25 with a pull at Schomberg. It begins at 6:30 p.m.
