Blue Light golf tourney

Daniel Talbot, Jim Rutledge, Danny Mijovic and Bob Panasiuk have confirmed their entries for the \$50,000 Labatt's Blue Light Pro-Am. Held at the Spring Lakes Golf Club in Stouffville, the 54-hole tournament is conducted by the Ontario Sportswriters and Sportsca- ters Association. All proceeds from the tournament go to the Tim Horton Children's Foundation which operates a summer camp near Parry Sound. For the first two days of the competition, 80 profes- sionals will be teamed with 80 three-man amateur teams. The pros will then carry their 36-hole score into the final round on Wednesday, June 26, to determine the winner. This year's champ receives \$10,000, the Blue Light Pro-Am trophy and a berth in this year's Canadian Open held at Glen Abbey in Oakville from July 4-7. Talbot, from Mon- treal, was the lead- ing money winner on the Canadian tour in 1984 earning \$22,625. The 32-year-old won the Quebec Open and was run- ner-up to Gar Hamilton in last year's Pro-Am. He won the inaugural event in 1983. Rutledge, a 25-year-old Victoria native, also had a successful 1984 season, winning the Canadian PGA. He finished third last year and was behind Talbot in winnings with \$21,684. Rutledge has been com- peting on the Asian tour this year. A 24-year-old Torontonian, Mijovic was the 1983 Canadian Amateur champion who won his first profes- sional tournament in November 1984 by taking the Mexican Open. He is also playing on the Asian tour. Panasiuk, a 43-year-old from Wind- sor, has been a steady performer on the Canadian golf scene for many years and is a two- time winner of the Canadian PGA in 1972 and 1973. These players join Dan Hallidorsen, currently the lead- ing Canadian on the U.S. PGA tour, with \$59,000; Dave Barr, who enjoyed an ex- ceptional 1984 tour winning \$113,336 and Gar Hamilton, who won the 1984 Labatt's Blue Light Pro-Am by a single stroke over Talbot.
