## Couples swing

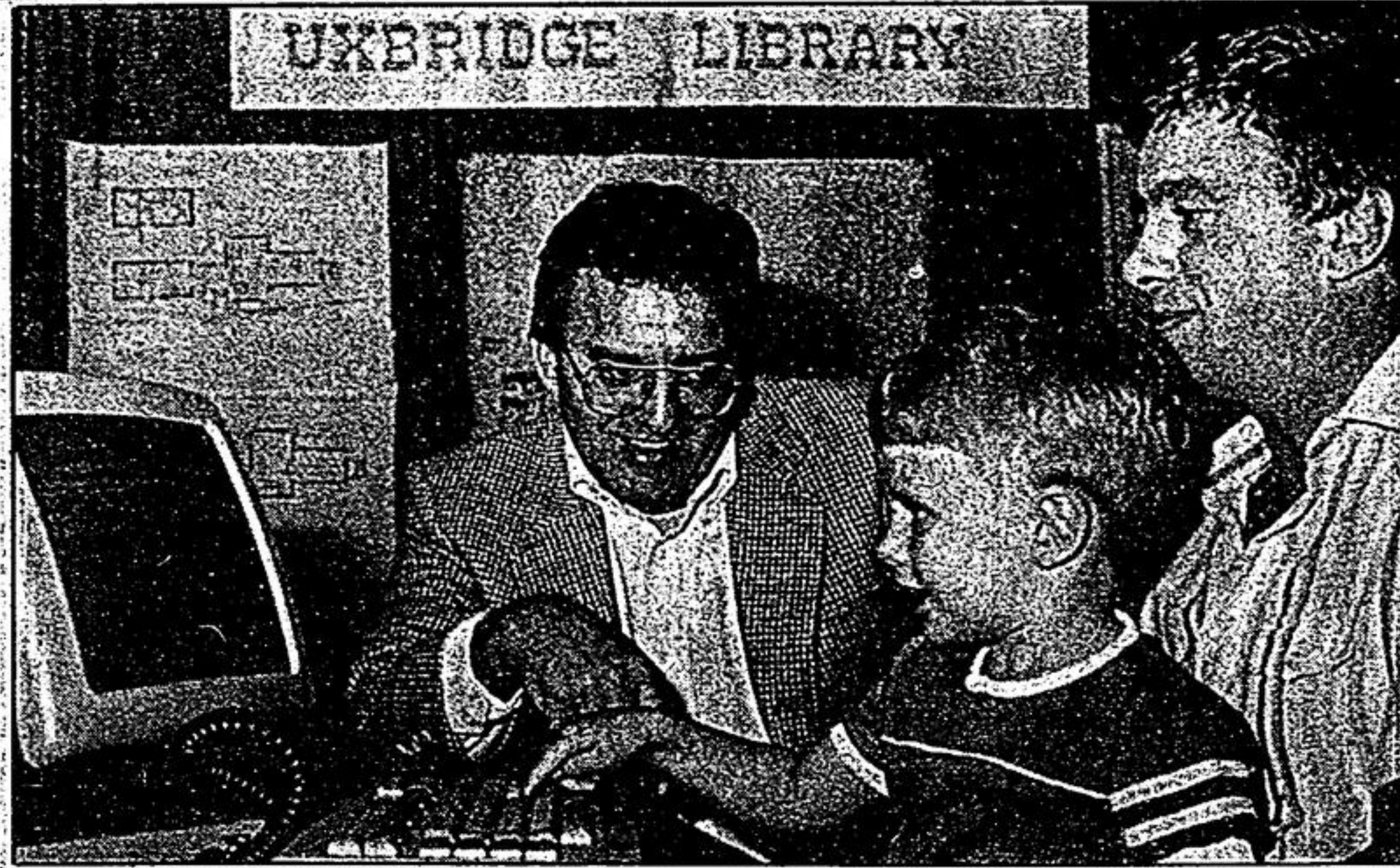
