THE MOST REV. LEWIS GARNSWORTHY Speaker

STOUFFVILLE — The Most Rev. Lewis Garnsworthy, Archbishop of Toronto, will be the guest speaker, Sunday, June 16, at Christ Church, (Anglican), Stouffville.

Time of the worship is 10 a.m. Rev. Garnsworthy is the Bishop and Chief Executive Officer of the second largest Anglican Diocese in North America. Only recently, his name was emblazoned across the front pages of every daily newspaper in Canada, when he criticized former Premier Wm. Davis for the method Mr. Davis employed in approving funding for Roman Catholic schools across the province. Rev. Garnsworthy spoke out against what he felt was the Government's arbitrary handling of this issue, likening it to the dictatorial actions of Adolf Hitler. In announcing Rev. Garnsworthy's coming to Christ Church, the congregation's pastor, Rev. Phillip Poole said: "My parish is honored to welcome its Archbishop and we extend a welcome to all residents of Stouffville to hear and meet one of Canada's most outstanding churchmen."
