If Walter Cronkite was still using those classic words at the end of his television program, "You Were There," he may well have described the events we have witnessed in Ontario.

In my discussions with York North residents, I have heard countless times that people feel David Peterson and the Liberal Party has earned the opportunity and the right to govern.
"Let's see what you can do," has been the most oft-heard remark. I can assure you, we're up to the challenge!
