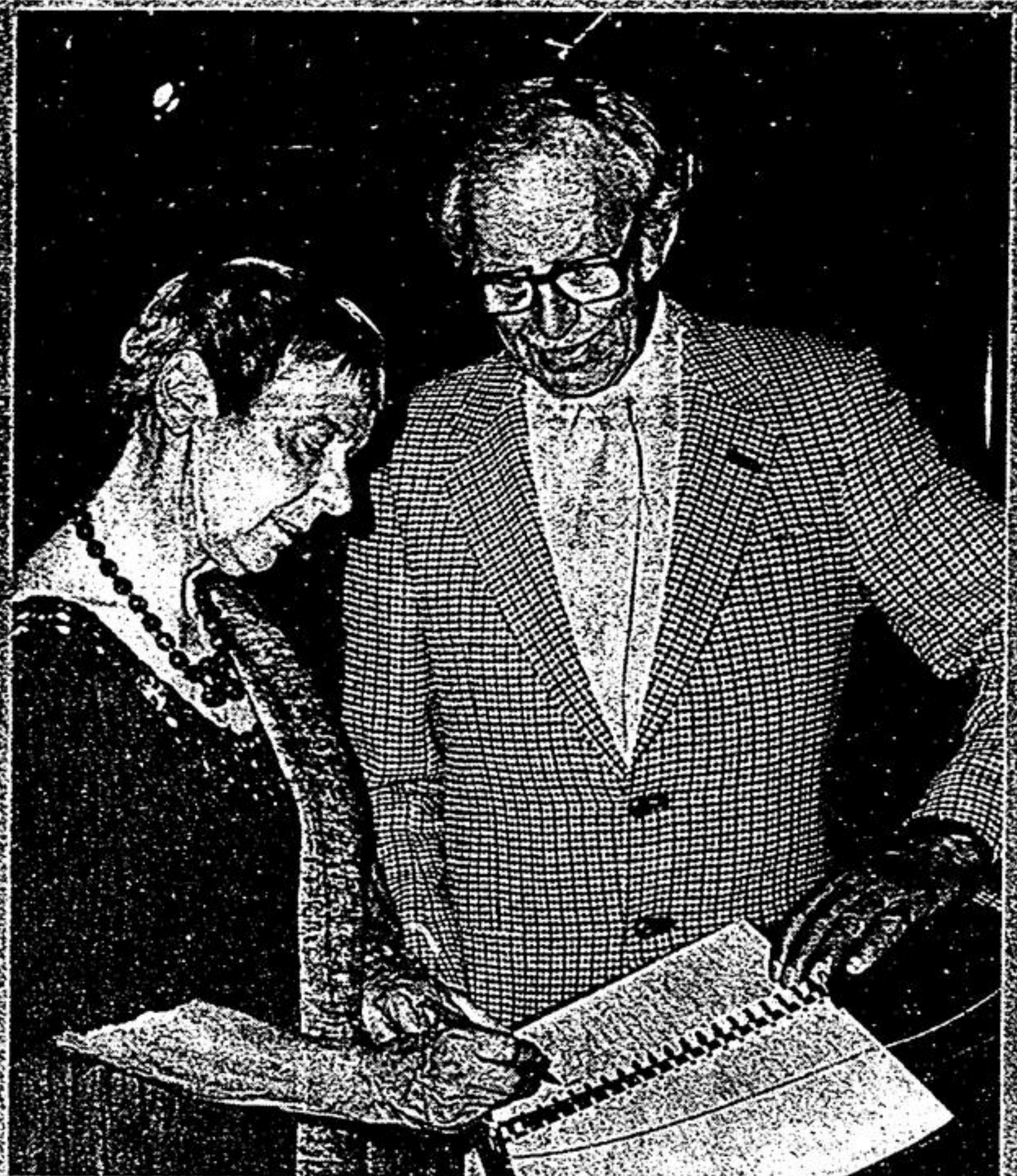
FROM WHEATON, ILL.
