

# Factory opening includes tours

UXBRIDGE TWP. — Uxbridge Twp. Mayor Bill Ballinger will participate in a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the new Tokai of Canada Limited factory Tuesday, June 18.

An open house begins at 10 a.m. with guided tours of the new butane lighter

manufacturing facility located on Durham Region Road 30 at the site of the former Lazy Lake Trailer Park.

The official opening ceremony will take place on the grounds at 12 noon. Scheduled participants include Tomio Nitta, president of Tokai Seiki Company Limited,

Ambassador of Japan to Canada, Kiyooki Kikuchi; and Mayor Ballinger.

The factory, which produces 2.4 million disposable lighters a month for the North American market, has been in operation since March.

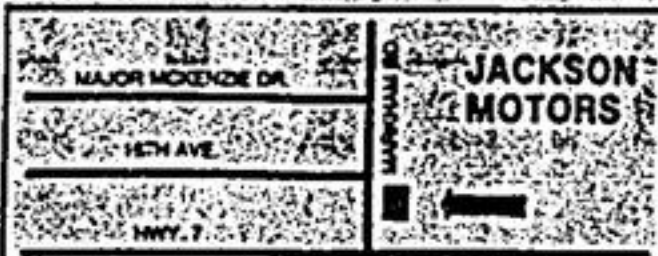

On Sunday, June 16, a Decoration Service will be held at Brougham Cemetery at 2 p.m., and in Stouffville at 2:30 p.m.

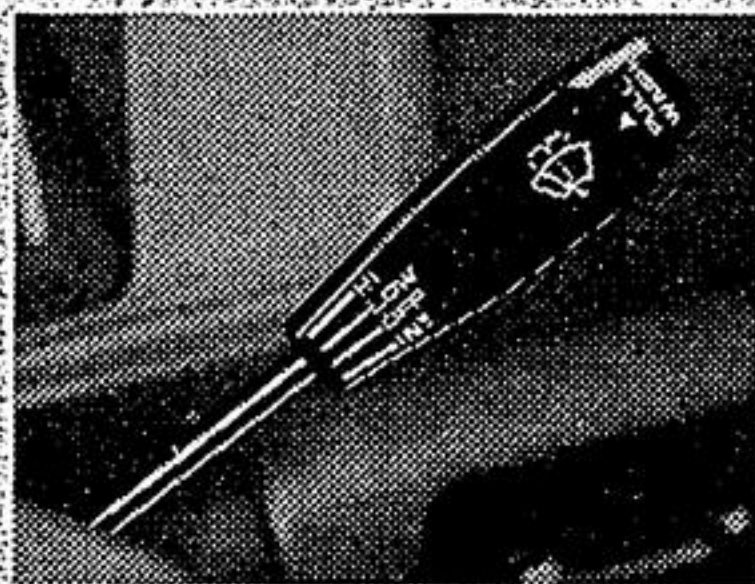

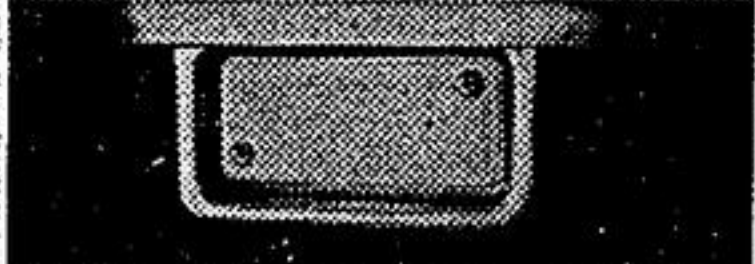
