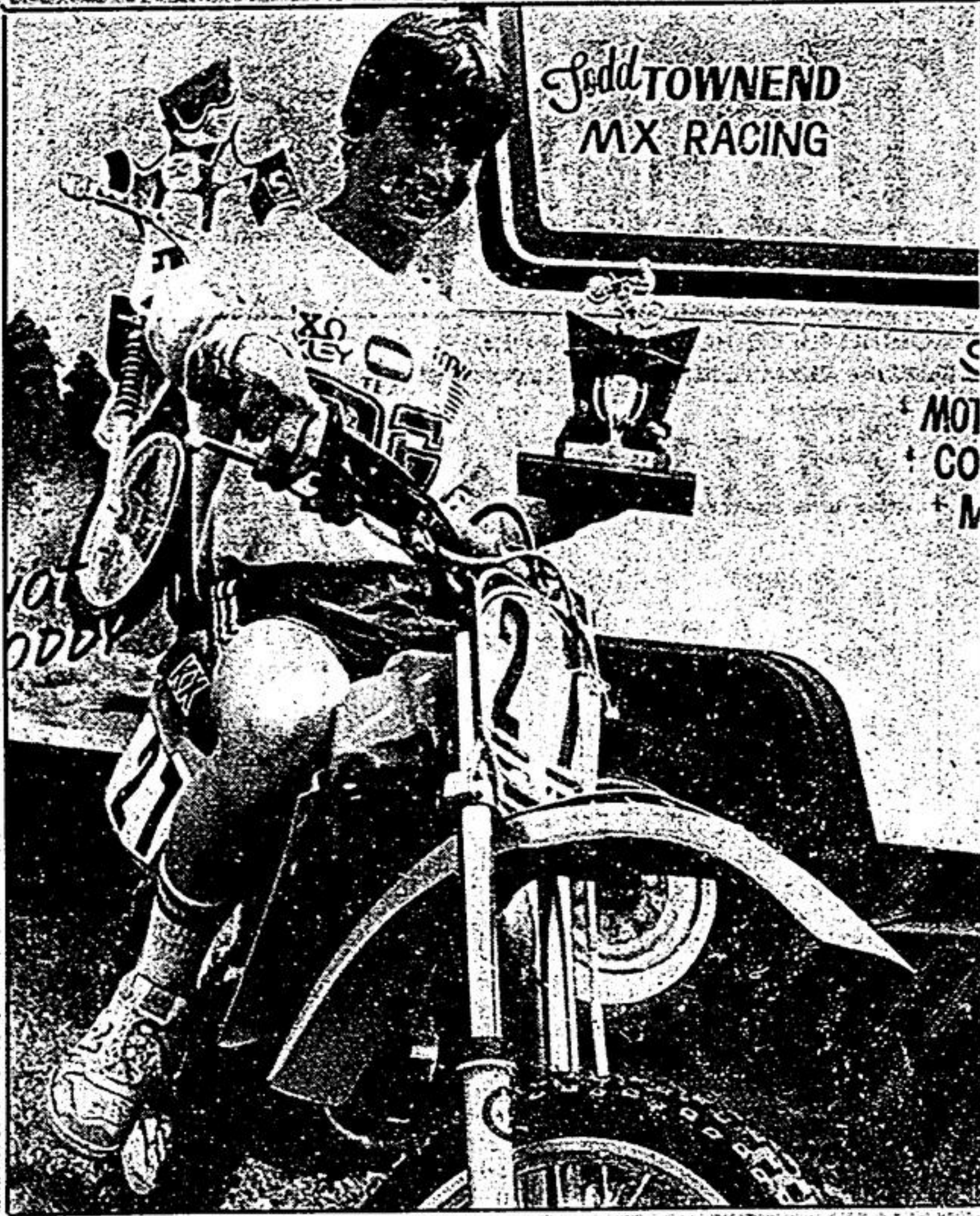

Townend displays skill

UXBRIDGE — Todd Townend of Cherry Street, R.R. 3, Stouffville, raced to victory at Monday's first annual Uxbridge Motocross.

The 14-year-old blended speed with a polished racing style to top a large field in the small wheel School Boy (80 c.c.) class. He also won his preliminary heat.

The Canada Day event, run by the Uxbridge Motocross Club in conjunction with the Optimist Club of Uxbridge, drew a crowd of over 1,000 to Elgin Park. It was an affiliated race of the Canadian Motorcycle Association.
