 We are very grateful for the generous publicity you have given the project in your newspaper.
 Public interest in Parkview Village seems to be at a high level, and it is certain the news reports and articles which you have published have contributed to this interest.
 It is the hope of the Parkview organization to provide enriched housing and programs from a Christian perspective which will contribute to the well-being of elderly persons. We see the new project as one component of a continuum of care and accommodation which also includes the present Home for the Aged and the 465 Rupert apartment building.
 In your July 10, 1985 article, you quote Project Superintendent Bruce Steinberg as saying the comple-

tion target date is January or February of 1986. Actually, the contract with Bradsl calls for completion by the last of April, 1986, and the many persons on our waiting list have already been made aware of the projected April target date.
 As construction progresses, other newsletters will be sent to our clientele and every effort will be made to inform them well ahead of the opening time, the date on which the facility will be ready for occupancy.
 This is important, because each potential tenant will likely have a home to sell or a lease to terminate before moving to Parkview Village.
 It is our objective to be as fair as possible with each applicant, and we wish to share with them information as it becomes available.

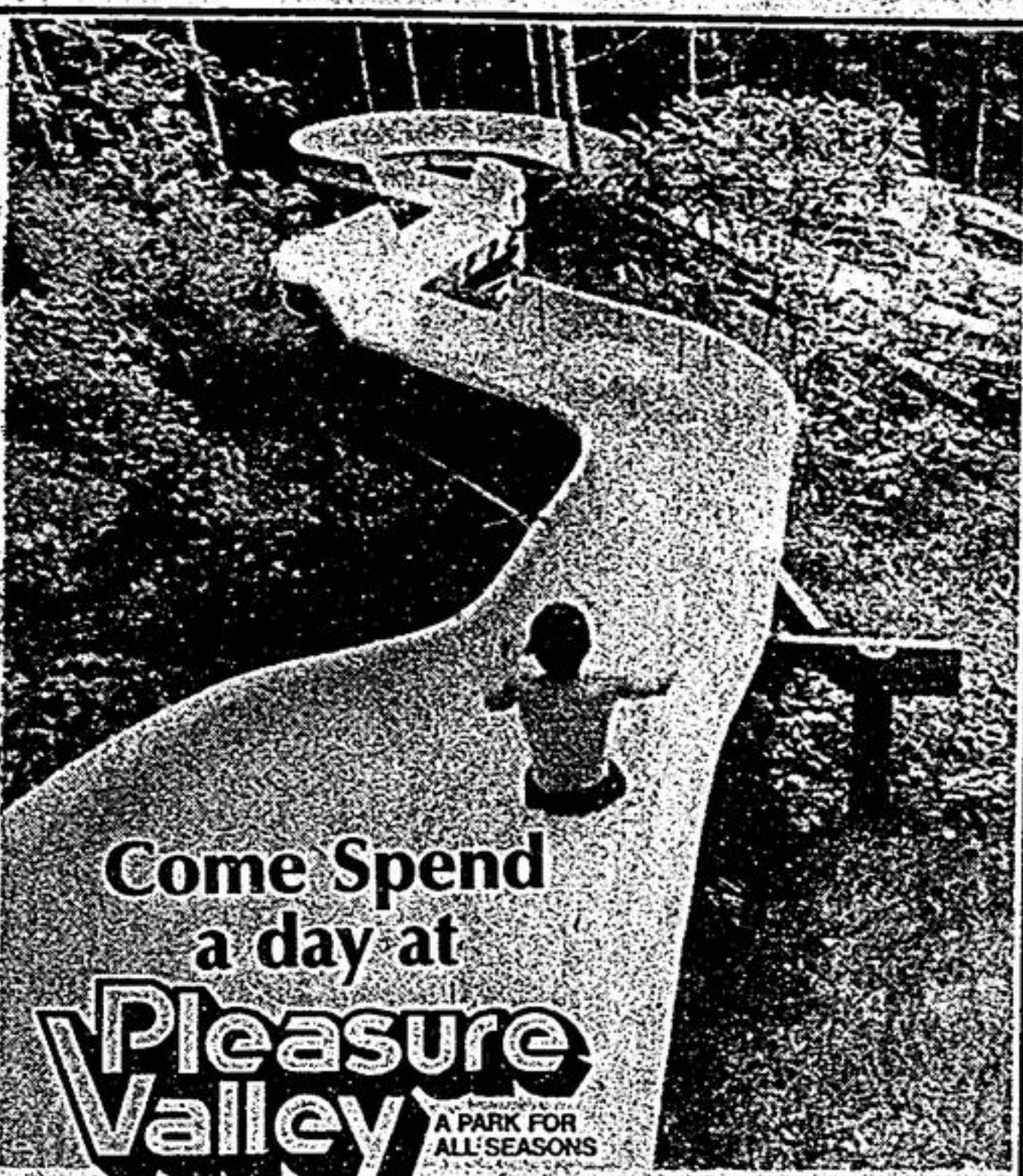

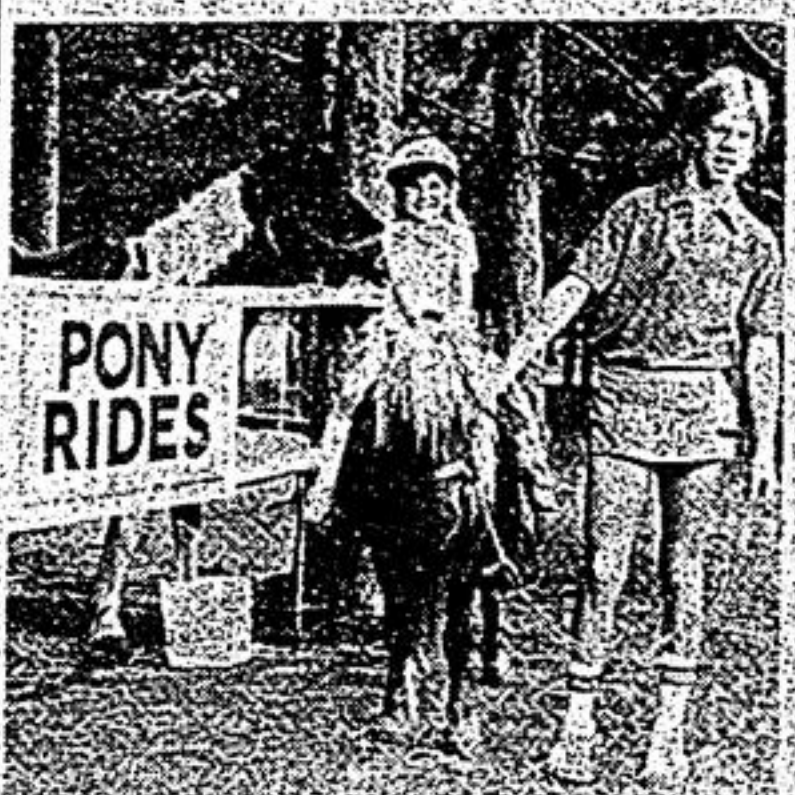
