Markham youth tops at college

Twenty-three-year-old Mark Sutherland of Markham won the prestigious President's Medal at Scarborough's Centennial College.

The President's Medal is awarded each year to the outstanding student of the graduating class, based on scholarship and extra-curricular participation.

Mr. Sutherland, a Grade 12 graduate from Markham District High School in 1980, said he was only an average student in high school.

After taking two years off and working full-time for the Markham Parks and Recreation, he decided to return to school.

"It was tough going back," said Mr. Sutherland. "You're making good money then all of a sudden you're broke."

During the two year program in Recreation Leadership, Mr. Sutherland received 27 As and one B grade. His courses included recreation activity, human growth and development, psychology and sociology.

One of his first semester courses included placement at the True Davidson Home for the Aged. The second semester he was placed at the Mayfair Tennis and Racquet Club in Thornhill running recreation programs.

During his second year of school, Mr. Sutherland spent 18 to 24 hours a week working for

the City of Scarborough Recreation and Parks Department in the special services section.

"Good time management is my secret," said Mr. Sutherland.

When he graduated this year, he was hired on full-time with the City of Scarborough Sports Services as a Recreation Administrative Assistant. "I really enjoy this job," he commented.

When at Centennial, Mr. Sutherland was the President of the Recreation Association and responsible for social events such as fun runs, dances and parties.

He was also a volunteer at Variety Village, a fitness centre for handicapped and able bodied people. While there he helped organize a soccer league for developmentally handicapped teens in Scarborough.

Part of his job while working for the special services department with the City of Scarborough, Mr. Sutherland was an executive of the Ontario Special Olympics and Civitan Clubs organizing committee for Provincial swim meets.

Besides working for the City of Scarborough, Mr. Sutherland also works part-time for Miracle Food Mart in Markham. With whatever time he has left over, he teaches tennis and plays a bit of softball.

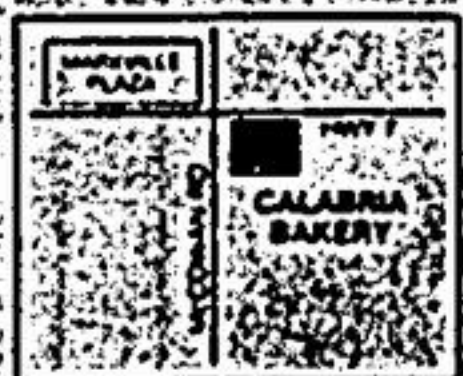
