

Expect 1,000 at picnic

MUSS LAKE — Between five hundred and a thousand people are expected to attend the 21st Century Centre's picnic this weekend, (July 27 and 28), at former Glendale Beach, Musselman's Lake.

Guest speaker will be noted African pastor and author, David Akinremi. Rev. Akinremi will discuss his perception of Ontario's food aid program to Africa and will introduce three new books on Christian issues.

Theme of the gathering will be "Countdown To The 21st Century: Will You Be Ready?"

Presentations will relate to freeze-dried food products and their various uses.

"We want to inform people concerning the advantages of freeze-dried foods," said Gordon Hamilton, the Centre's manager. "These products could provide solutions to many of today's problems, both in Africa and at home."

Rev. Akinremi will take samples of the food back to Africa when he returns July 31.

"I'll test them out on my people," explained the pastor. "If everything goes well, I'll return in October and arrange for more supplies."

The cost of his trip will be covered by the picnic's admission fee—adults \$3 per day and \$2 for children.

Activities during the weekend will include swimming, wind-surfing, paddle-boating, horseshoe-pitching, chess, ping-pong, soccer, instrumental and gospel music. A special children's program is also planned.

The Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum is located on the west side of Don Mills Road, (Woodbine Avenue), three miles north of the Bloomington Road in the hamlet of Vandorf.

In case of rain, the show will be held Aug. 18.
