## Country vacation

**CLAREMONT** — Special visitors were on hand to watch the Claremont men's softball team take on Port Perry Wednesday night. Approximately 20 physically disabled adults from the Recreational Holiday Camp program sponsored by the Ontario March of Dimes, caught the ball action behind the homeplate screen. This particular sports outing was part of a 10-day holiday package operated at the Claremont Conservation Area. The campers stay at the Outdoor Education Field Centre, Claremont, R.R. 2. A staff of 21, including nurses and counsellors, look after the special needs of the various adults for the duration of the session. Four 10-day camps are conducted every summer at this particular facility. "These people come from various backgrounds... they have different physical disabilities, and this program gives them a break... a holiday... and everybody needs one," said counsellor Mike Nadeau. The holiday program is so popular said Nadeau that people must apply during the winter to be assured of a spot in one of the sessions. The field centre, located on Westney Road, includes a dormitory that sleeps up to 50 persons with all the conveniences of home. The adults on this particular excursion were scheduled to visit the Kleinburg festival, a shopping centre in Oshawa and an airport. "We give these people a chance to visit places they wouldn't ordinarily see," said Nadeau, who added quite enthusiastically "this is my fourth year as a counsellor; there has to be something that keeps bringing me back every summer!"
