It's calving time at the Woodland farm and this was our experience on Saturday afternoon:

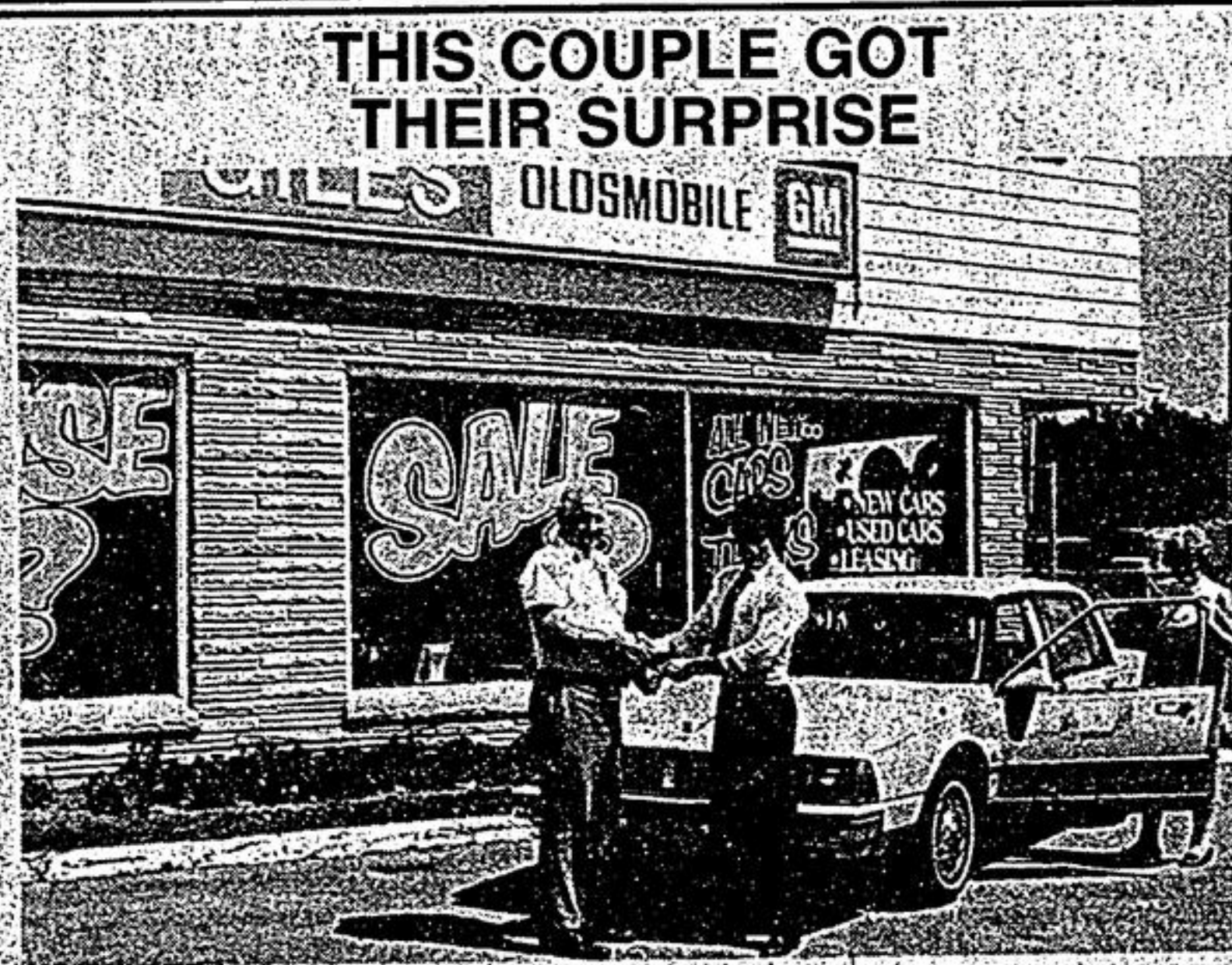
It's calving time here on the farm

 Coaxing her to the stable with her baby's wee twin

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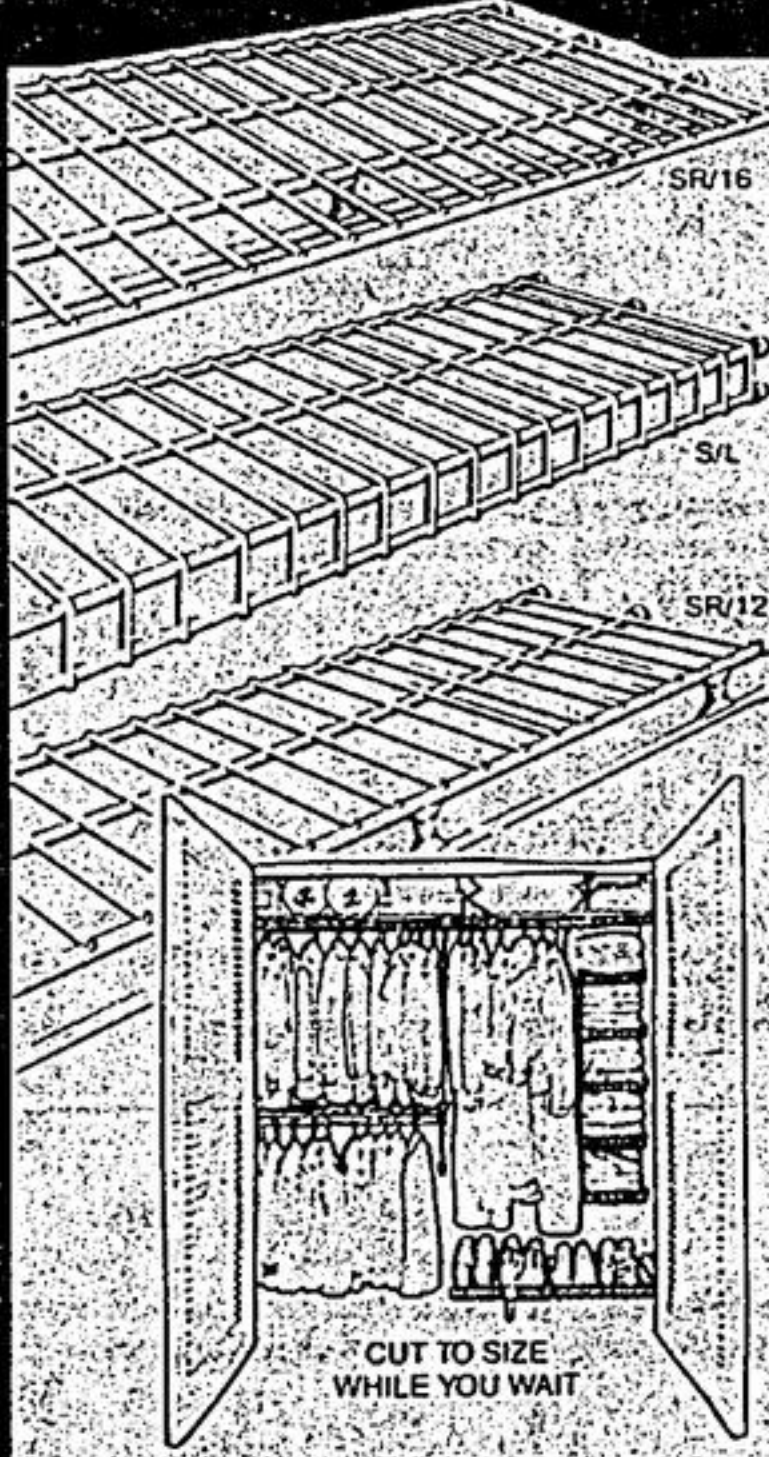
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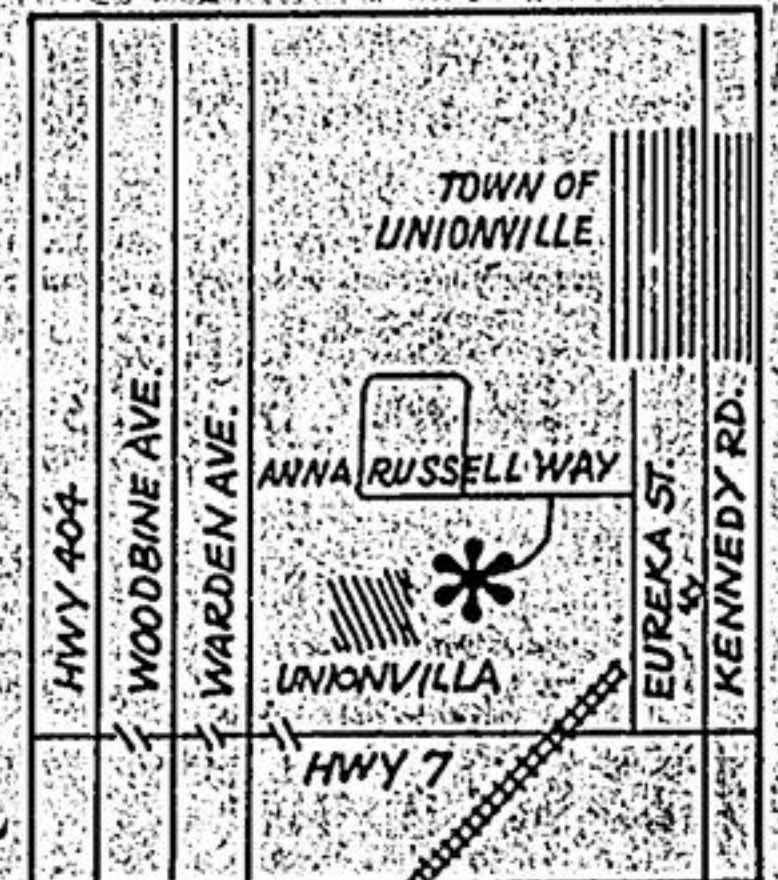
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
