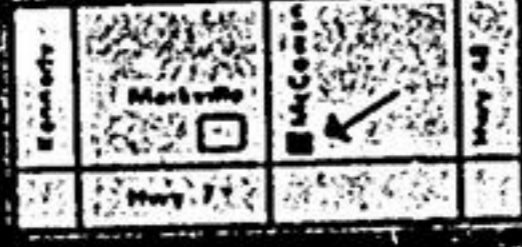

# Car-racing project would benefit town

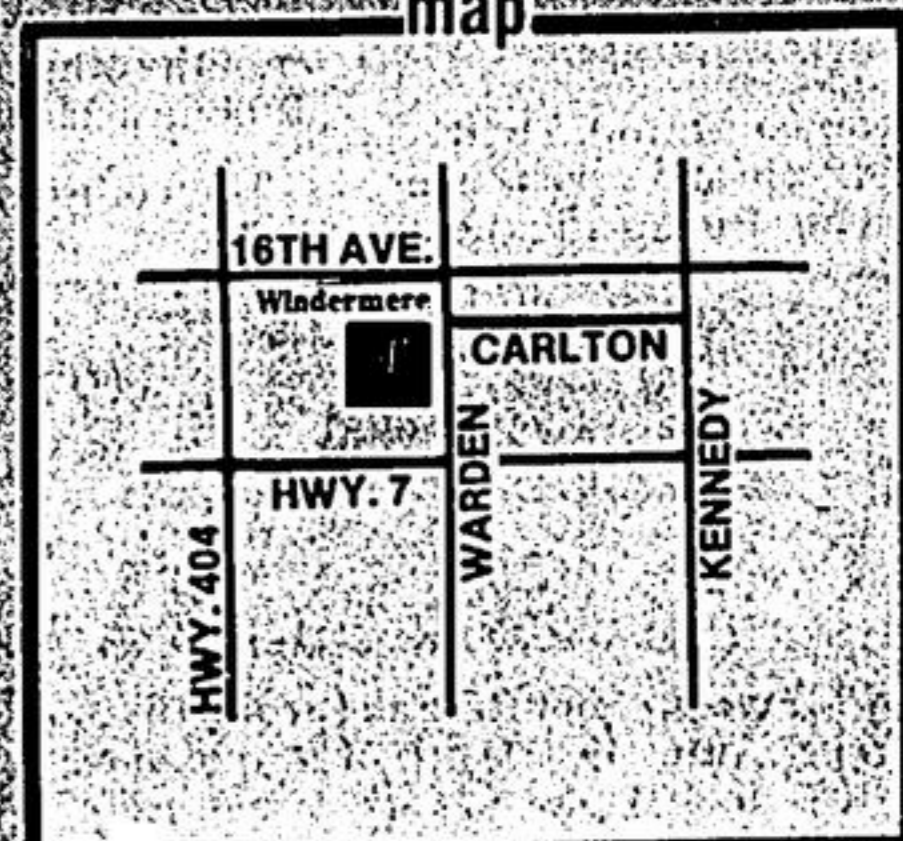
