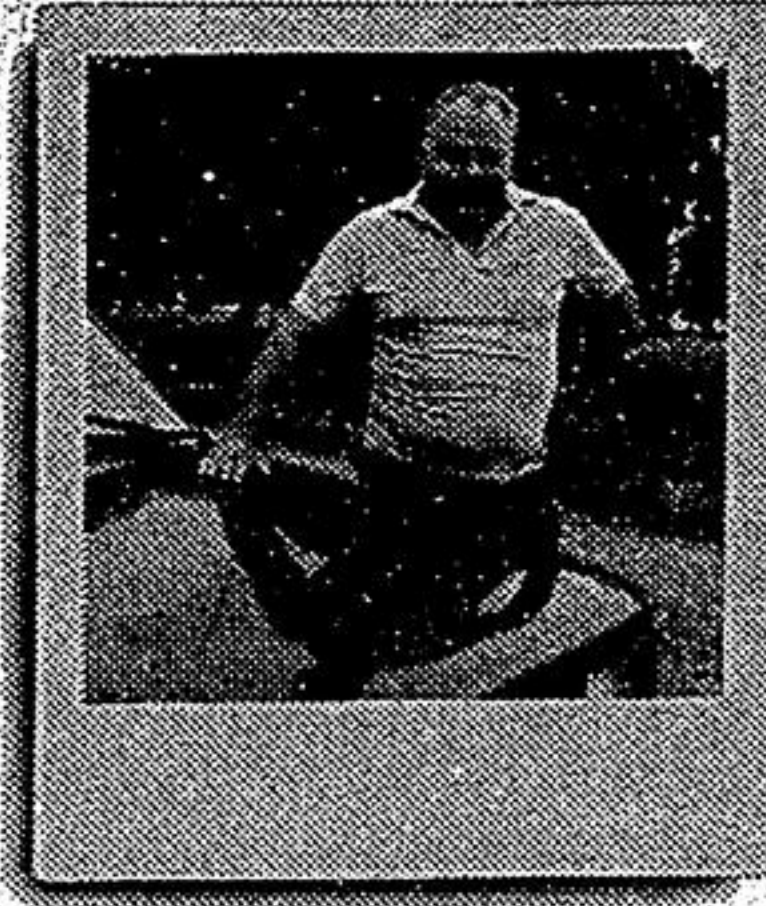
The dealer who sold Iris her first Hyundai Pony was so impressed by her enthusiasm for the car that he offered her a job selling Ponys.

A lot of people say they don't look that big—that was my first opinion when I looked at it. But I'll tell you, when you get into it, it's super. I call this my super little car."



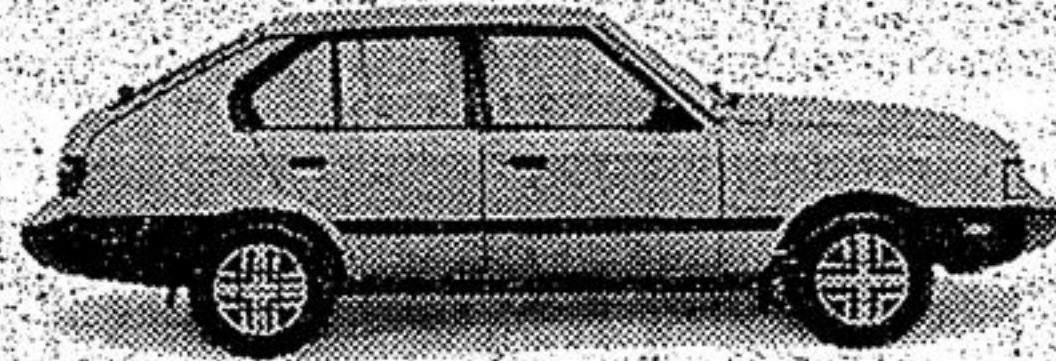
Darcy Ducharme, Winnipeg, Manitoba

The rescue of a small boy from the waters of Lake Simcoe by a 17-year-old Stouffville girl, was a heart-warming story. (Tribune-July 17).

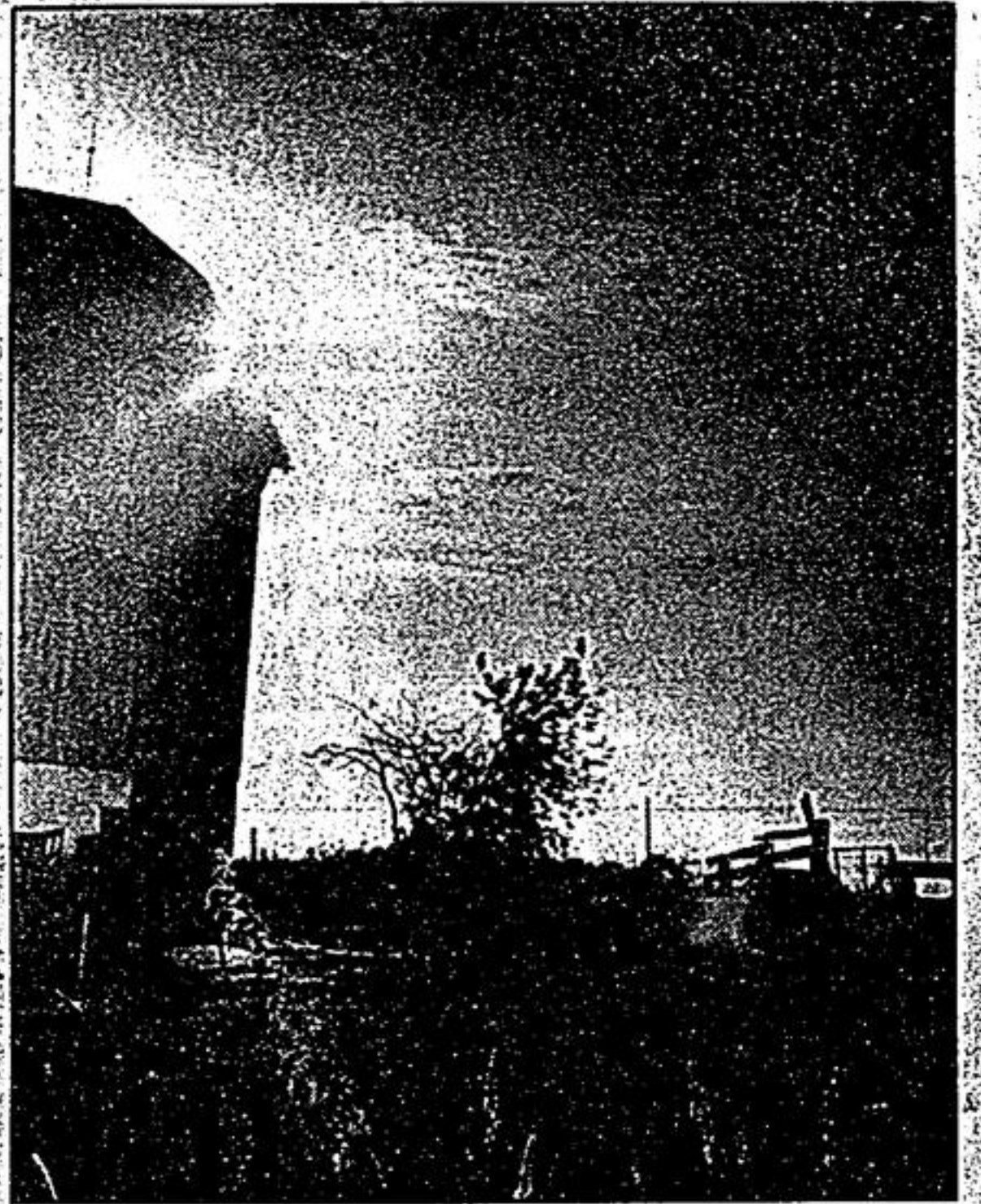
While the near-tragedy is alarming, think of the result had the swim instructor not been there or had not reacted with the speed and efficiency she did.

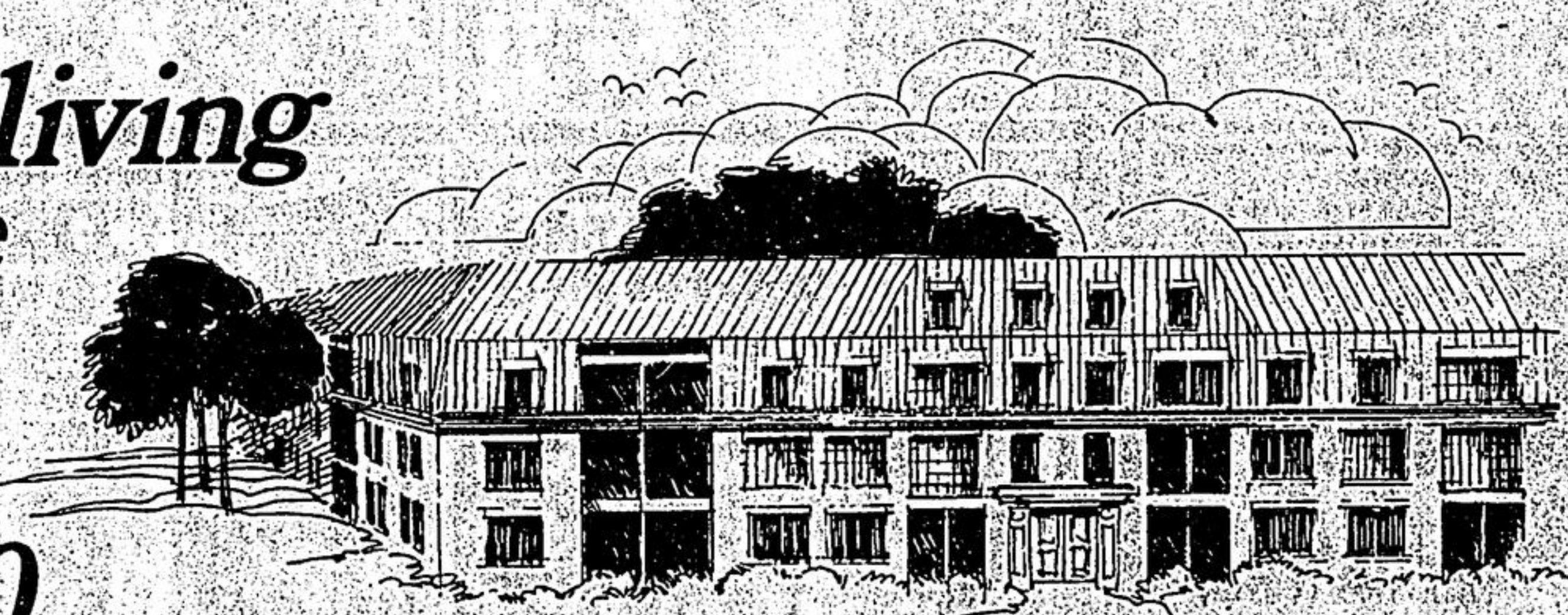


Sun set a scenic sight

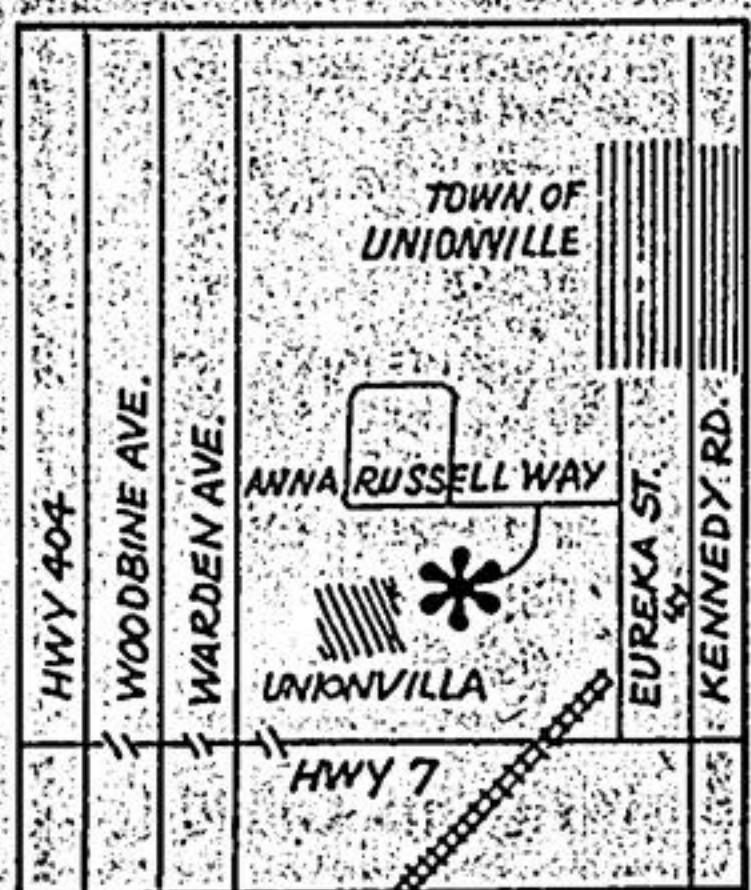
