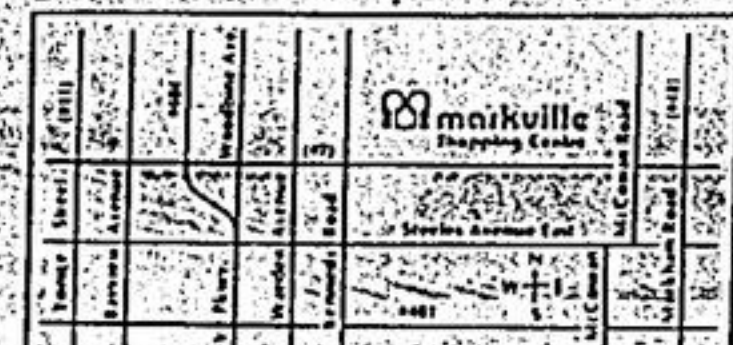

## Markham Fair is shaping up

 MARKHAM — Are there any dogs out there with unusually long ears? Does your baby have that winning smile? Can anyone stroke a mean fiddle? If so, the Markham Fair is the place to be.

The theme of this year's Fair is 'Being Alive in 85' which suits Contests committee member Robyn Scott just fine. She says things will be very much alive as competitive spirits begin to stir when the Fair arrives.

"There are a lot of things going on at the Fair this year so hopefully things can work out for everybody," Ms. Scott said.

Along with the spelling bee, fiddling contest and pet show, Ms. Scott added there will be the regular Fair competition classes: Homecrafts and hobbies, art, Christmas collections, domestic science, needlecrafts and photography will be judged once again for the 1985 Fair.

"There have been a few changes this year, but I think the Fair will succeed once again," Ms. Scott noted.

She pointed out that with the commencement of this year's Fair some past contests will be dropped from the itinerary. Bubble-blowing, Teeny Talent and the Chip off the Old Block contests will be missing in 1985.

"There are many exciting things going on this year again," said Promotion Director Diane Ward. "Each year everyone tries that little bit harder to make the Fair a success."

Special Attractions committee member Rick Wannop said Fair-goers will have lots to see this year. While awaiting finalization on some attractions, he's confident things will pan out.

"Hopefully we'll get an even better crowd than last year," Mr. Wannop said. "We're still working on a couple of things."

Features planned this year include shows by the OPP's Golden Helmets precision riding team and an All-Terrain Cycle (ATC) Pull in the livestock arena. Fair-goers can also see antique steam engine thrashers, a tractor pull and a tentatively scheduled demolition derby.

"Of course there are the regulars like horse races, but I think the ATC pull will be something that's pretty exciting to watch," said Mr. Wannop.

One of the special features Fair directors hope to present is a show starring country and western singer Tommy Hunter.

Mrs. Ward added that the class for the handicapped promises to be a hit again this year.

"Last year a girl who won in the handicapped class in her section donated her wall hanging, something she had taken a long time to make," Mrs. Ward said.

She added that directors hope to raise money for the Markham-Stouffville Hospital once again in the cake decorating category.

"There's a kind of fever pitch we all build up to," Mrs. Ward said. "We're all running around getting the Fair going again."
