# More runners needed for Hospital run

More participants are needed for the upcoming Economist and Sun/Great Gulf Homes Fun Run. That's the word from organizer, Charlie Canning, who reports "we were hoping for a hundred runners, but so far we haven't attained that."  
The event — which is raising money for the Markham

Stouffville Hospital Building Fund — is set for Sunday, Sept. 8. It starts at 10:30 a.m. at Great Gulf's Windermere subdivision on Warden Ave. in Unionville. A tour through Unionville makes up the 10-kilometre route, and a one-kilometre kiddie run takes place as soon as the main race is finished.  
"Participants can either race competitively or just have a good time," said Mr

Canning, an advertising representative for the Economist and Sun. "It doesn't have to be an all-out dash."  
There is also an option of putting together a team to run the route, thereby cutting down the distance each participant must cover.  
As soon as all the runners (adult and children) are finished, a barbecue will be held at the Windermere site. There will also be prizes for

the top three men, women and children (except for the teams) in the two runs.  
The top prize for the men and women is a year's membership — worth \$500 — at the New Body's fitness institute on Main Street in Markham.  
Volunteers are still needed to help with the barbecue and running the first aid stations. Running clubs are also welcome to take part in the race.

The \$5 entry fee deadline has been extended a day to Tuesday. Afterwards, it goes up to \$10 per person. Children under 12 free.
