'Cat' trades dancing shoes for workboots

When Cat Duly goes to work she becomes one of the guys.

And in her line of work, that's not easy: Cat (Cathie) is a heavy machine operator.

She's most content when manning the controls of a scraper, grader, bulldozer or front-end loader, and hopes to land a job loading trucks in a quarry.

The five-foot, 95-pound part-time model recently graduated with top honors from the 15-week heavy equipment program at Sheridan College in Milton.

She is qualified to drive and maintain front-end loaders, bulldozers, back-hoes and graders.

Cat, 27, and her husband Derek, a professional body builder, are currently living at Cedar Beach in Musselman's Lake.

Cat's present job is at a construction site in Aurora where she appropriately operates a '77 'Cat' loader.

Enjoyable job

"It's a scream. I'm having a good time and they're (her fellow employees) working," she said.

Cat decided to take the heavy equipment course after 11 years of teaching dance.

"My patience level ran out," explained Cat. "I've never had much patience and

can handle machines a lot better than people."

Cat, a self-confessed tomboy, said she's always been mechanically inclined and interested in machinery. She especially enjoys travelling around on her Honda 750 motorcycle.

Career move

"I knew I had to change jobs and that's the only thing that interests me," she said. "I've always been able to drive anything."

Cat admits working with 40 men in a traditionally male-orientated field wasn't easy at first, but she quickly proved herself capable and earned the respect of her classmates.

"I fit right in as one of the boys," said Cat. "They take me serious, but I did have to prove myself. If you can't operate it shows."

She added the toughest part of the job is getting up at the crack of dawn.

"The job's a piece of cake. More women should get into it," said Cat. "The men have been playing this game for a long time. The machines do all the work."

Although constantly surrounded by heavy machinery, Cat's biggest concern on the job is not getting physically hurt, but developing "a secretary's spread" from sitting all day.
