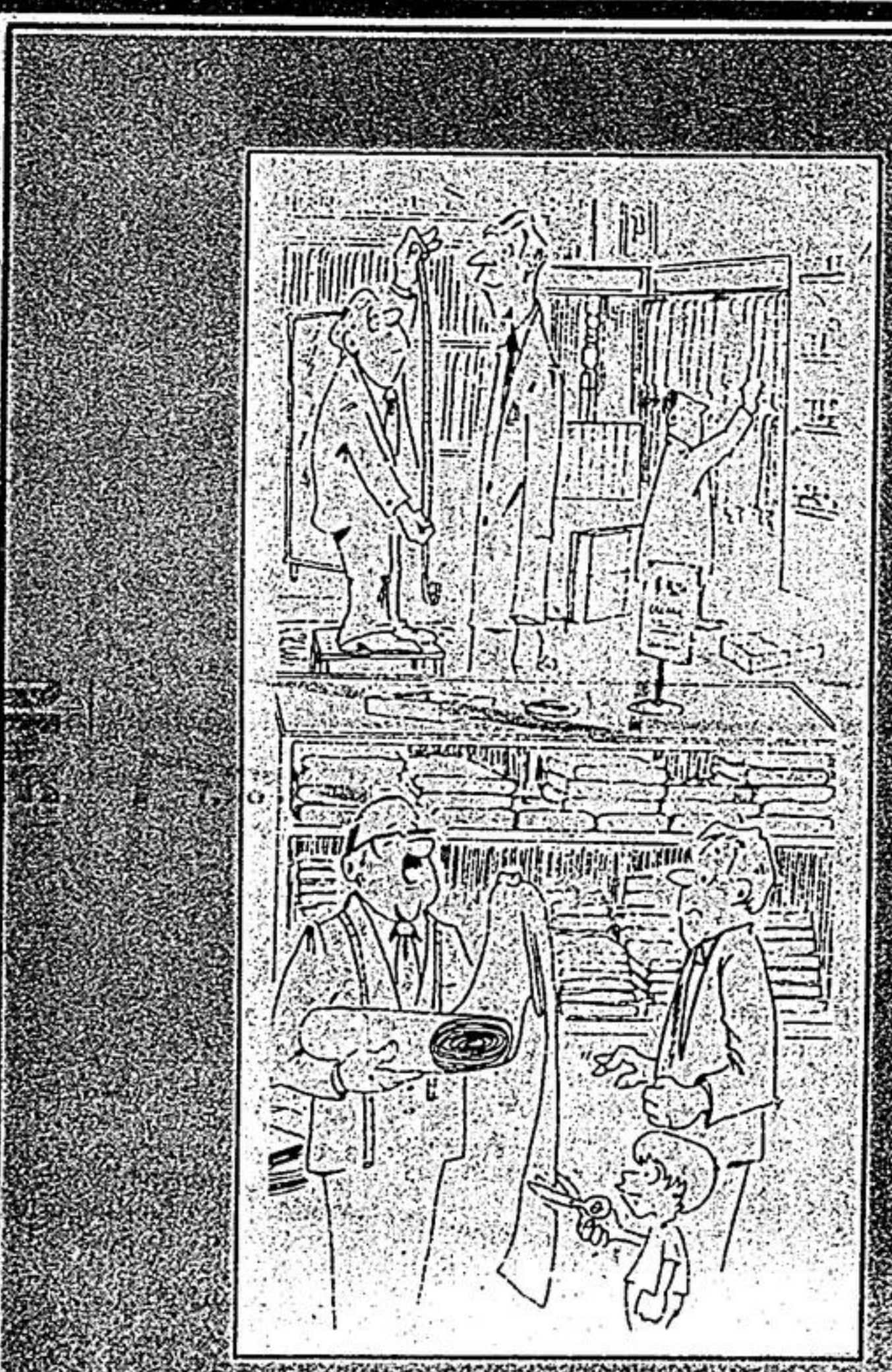

## Rural mail recipient Won't raise box

WHITCHURCH — Mrs. Yolanda Cinelli, R.R. 4, Stouffville, is irritated by a Post Office decision to force certain area residents to raise their mailboxes. So far, she's refused to comply.  
Mrs. Cinelli claims the demands were launched as a result of a her carrier's decision to use a truck instead of a car to make drops along his route (McCowan Road, north of Stouffville Road).  
"It's not fair," says Mrs. Cinelli, "I've had my box like this for 12 years and now, just because the driver wants to use a higher vehicle, I have to raise it."  
Mrs. Cinelli says she phoned the Post Office to voice her complaint but the man who answered refused to listen.  
"When I was telling him why I feel I shouldn't have to move the box, he hung up

on me," she says.  
Mrs. Cinelli claims the Post Office has threatened to remove her name from the delivery list if she doesn't raise her box two to three inches, and soon.  
Most of Mrs. Cinelli's neighbors have already raised theirs, she admits.  
"I don't know why they moved them," she says, "we're not yo-yos, we're taxpayers and we have rights."  
"We're not animals either, and shouldn't be treated as such," she continues.  
Mrs. Cinelli is hoping other area residents will join in her fight to keep the boxes where they are.  
"If we bow down this time, we'll be sorry," says Mrs. Cinelli. "Who's to say that next year, the carrier won't decide to use a car and we'll be forced to readjust our boxes again."
