

Opposing Merv is the Canadian Labour Congress, the National Union of Provincial Government Employees, the Ontario Federation of Labour, and the Ontario Public Service Employees' Union.

Dennis McDermott has sworn under oath that a successful court challenge by Merv Lavigne "might well imperil the strength, or even the existence, of the Canadian Labour Congress".

An official from the Ontario Public Service Employees' Union said that "a finding against the unions would mean that the OFL and the CLC might as well close up shop".

The Big Union movement fears that given a free choice, very few dues-paying Canadian workers would voluntarily support political parties and causes with which they disagree.

That's why the Big Union movement wants to use force.
