

Trustees after one seat

UXBRIDGE day while Brian Kennedy announced his re-election bid earlier this summer.

In the Nov. 12 election, Uxbridge Twp. will receive representation from one public school trustee instead of

the present two. The Twp. of Scugog will move up from one to two trustees because its equalized assessment has edged ahead of Uxbridge.

In a prepared news release, Mrs. Beveridge said that representation is an important issue even more so now that Uxbridge has only one board member.

"The representation of Uxbridge Twp. at the regional level must be strong and persistent," she said. "With the development of all of Durham, the pressure for increased funds and facilities in the southern portion of the Region continues to overwhelm the funds available. A strong voice and active, full-time representation is required."

And because of the province's existing school financing shortage, she said extension of Separate School funding is "not in the best interest of students, Catholic or Public, or taxpayers."

Other election issues, according to the 14-year Uxbridge Twp. resident, centre around facilities planning and access to appropriate programming for all local students.

The five-year board veteran said she has been concerned with the planning and maintenance of the physical facilities in all areas of the Township.

"The Uxbridge facilities plan not only reflects the needs of the stu-

dents of Uxbridge Twp. but it prepares them for the future of an expanding community," she stated.

Mr. Kennedy said he opposes trustee Beveridge on the matter of trustee pay increases, believing that the recent 11 per cent salary hike was just too high.

The 46-year-old St. John's School employee feels another major issue is immersion French. He the program's future is uncertain due to dwindling enrolment numbers in certain parts of the region.

Mr. Kennedy, a resident on Main Street, has served on the school board for five years and, before that, chaired parks and recreation.

Candidate will try again

UXBRIDGE Ian Ball, who ran unsuccessfully for the mayoralty of Uxbridge Township when he was just 19, will attempt to win a seat on Council in Ward 4.

Mr. Ball, now 24, made his decision after learning that incumbent Sandy Ewen will not seek re-election in Ward 4 (the portion of town south of Brock Street).

Although he was again defeated in the 1983 municipal election, that time by councillor Ian Morrison in Ward 5, Mr. Ball remains eager to become involved in the level of government he describes as "closest to the people."

The fact that Ward 4 is his home riding was another determining factor in his election bid,

according to the Balsam Street resident.

He views public involvement as an essential ingredient in the civic government process and will be stressing that as voters go to the polls Nov. 12.

"If you want to be satisfied in the urban environment where you live, you should have input into the growth or change in that area," Mr. Ball said. "I think everybody should have some say in the planning process."

And he feels more participation can be generated by increased advertising of official public meetings to allow input from more ratepayers.

Another idea is to have rotating council meetings so that

the Township's hamlets "don't feel left out," he said. The sessions could be staged throughout the municipality in order to generate more widespread interest.

The candidate would also like to see the Twp. increase some densities in the downtown area to create additional apartment space.

"There's room in the town to accommodate more people, yet still make it livable," he claimed.

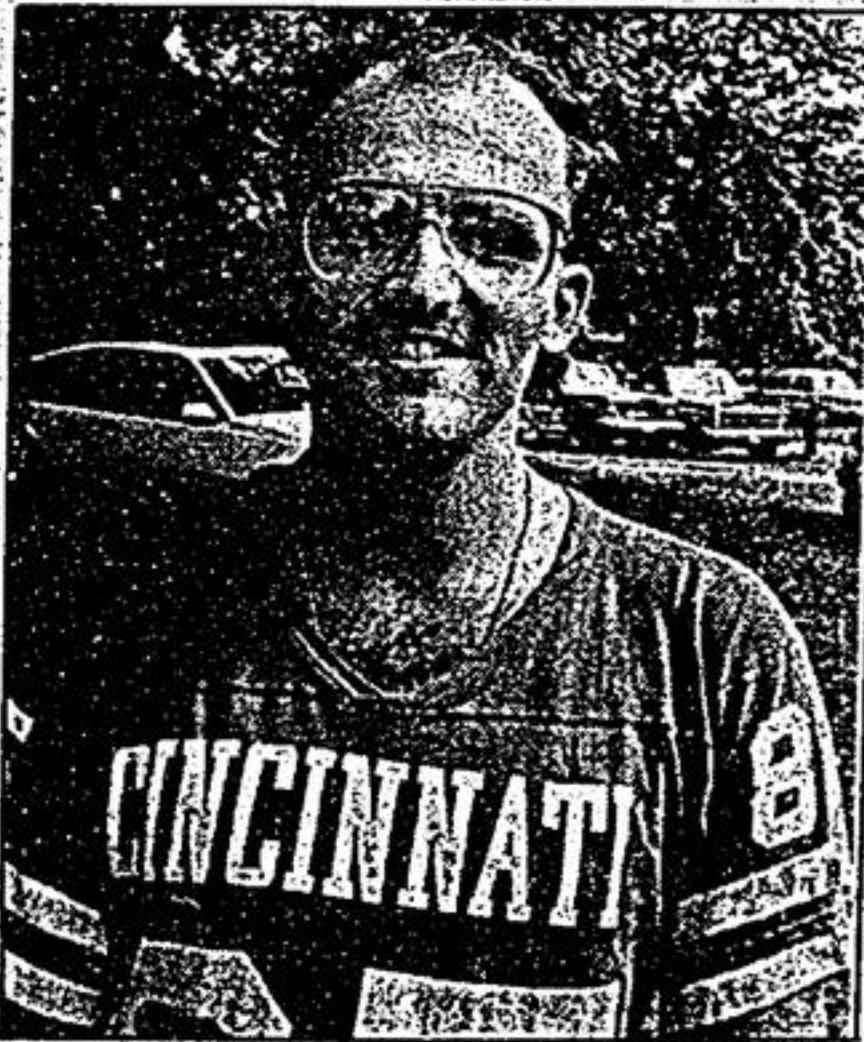
