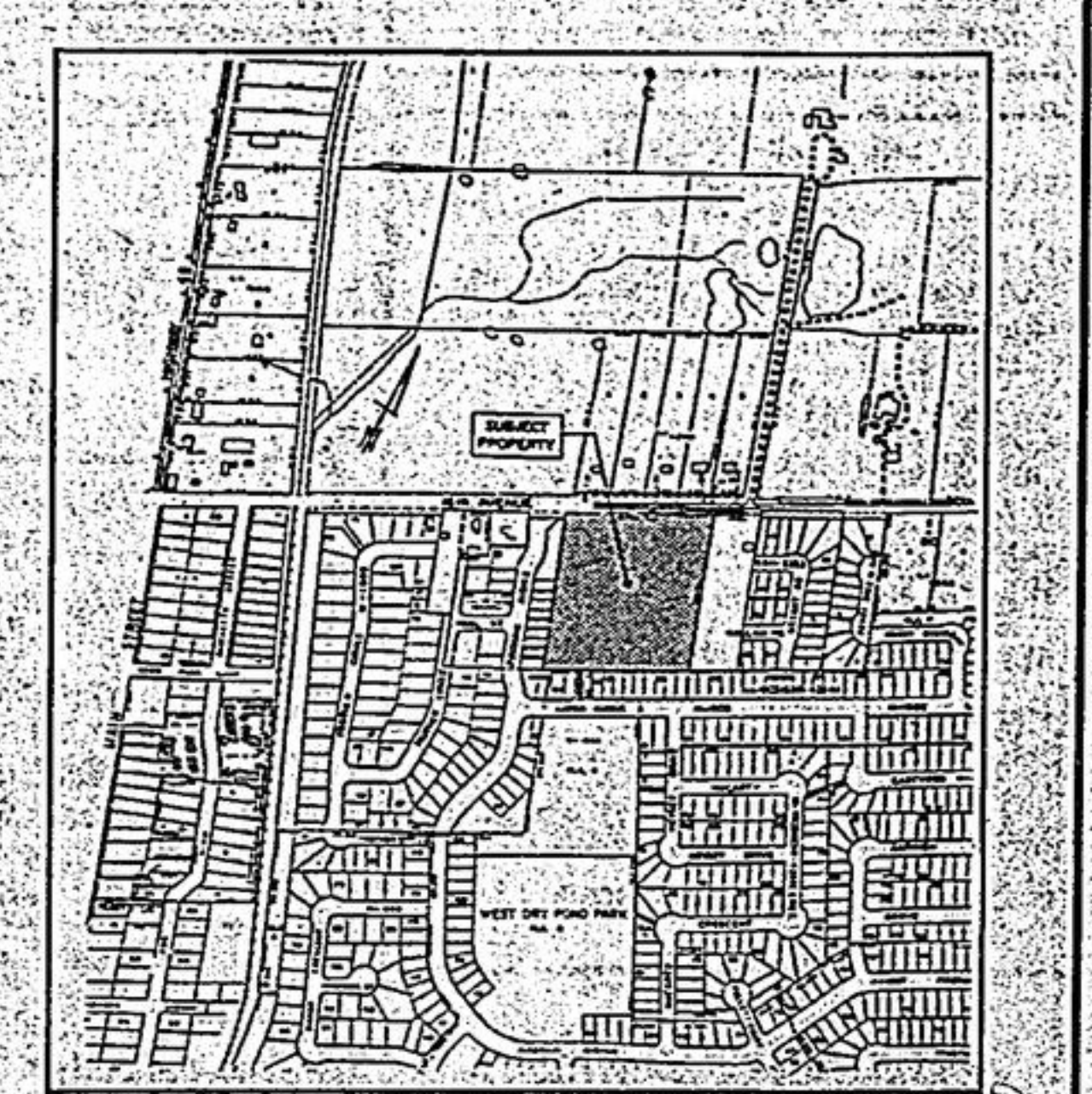

NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN OF MARKHAM NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A ZONING BY-LAW BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MARKHAM CORRECTION

WHEREAS Notice of the passing of By-law 305-85 by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 20th day of August, 1985 was published in the Markham Economist and Sun on September 4th, 1985 in accordance with the provisions of Section 34 of The Planning Act, 1983; AND WHEREAS the purpose of By-law 305-85 is to delete a 3.56 hectare parcel of land on the south side of 16th Avenue, approximately 12,214 metres east of Fincham Avenue from the area covered by Interim Control By-law 125-85 and from the area covered by By-law 2325-68, as amended, to permit a proposed plan of subdivision on the subject lands; AND WHEREAS the key map included in the Notice published on September 4th, 1985 was incorrectly published and applied to lands which were not subject to the provisions of By-law 305-85; THEREFORE TAKE NOTICE that the following is a key map showing the correct location of the lands to which By-law 305-85 applies:



AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the by-law by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Markham not later than the 24th day of September, 1985 a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection.
