## Auction set for Durham

Durham Region hosts its 11th annual Public Auction indoors at the Ajax Depot today, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The sale site is located on Durham Region Road 4 (Taunton Road West) and Salem Road, R.R. 1, Pickering.

Over 300 items will be offered for sale on an "as is, where is" basis, including cars, trucks, tractors, lawn mowers, chain saws, office furniture and equipment.

There'll be a preview showing of sale goods on Friday, Sept. 13, between 4 and 8 p.m.

The Region is staging the auction in conjunction with the Cities of Oshawa and Peterborough, the Towns of Ajax, Pickering, Newcastle, Richmond Hill and Whitby, as well as the Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority.

## VIA Rail ridership on the increase

Rider capacity on the VIA Rail dayliner has to be doubled on some weekdays in order to meet the increasing number of commuters using the reinstated service.

Ridership has risen to about 55 people a day each way on the Toronto-Havelock line, according to VIA public affairs officer Deborah Etsten. This is up from the earlier average of between 35 to 40 passengers.

She said the number of commuters has been gradually climbing during the three months it has been back on track.

Mondays and Fridays are the

busiest times for the train, Ms. Etsten noted, and an extra car is usually required on those days.

The train makes stops at Claremont, Dagmar and Myrtle in Durham Region.

The service was restored by the Progressive Conservative government in June, following its cancellation by the Liberals nearly four years ago.

Area MPs have made it clear to constituents that the line will be de-railed once again unless it gains substantial public support. It's now on a two-year trial period.


