

# 4 charged in search for stolen property

Durham Regional Police have laid a variety of charges following a Sept. 4 search at a residence near Goodwood.

Charged with possession of stolen property valued over \$200 are a man and three women, between the ages of 20 and 30. The four Uxbridge Township residents also face several drug-related offences.

They're scheduled to appear in Ajax provincial court Oct. 3.

Officers apprehended a person seen removing wheels from cars on the lot of Uxbridge's Williamson Motors. He was charged with attempted theft and mischief.

Subsequent questioning led police to the Goodwood-area residence, where the property, including household furnishings, was confiscated.

Cst. Fitzgerald said it's suspected the goods were stolen from locations Durham Region, Metro-Toronto and vicinity. He's now conducting interviews in an attempt to identify the owners.

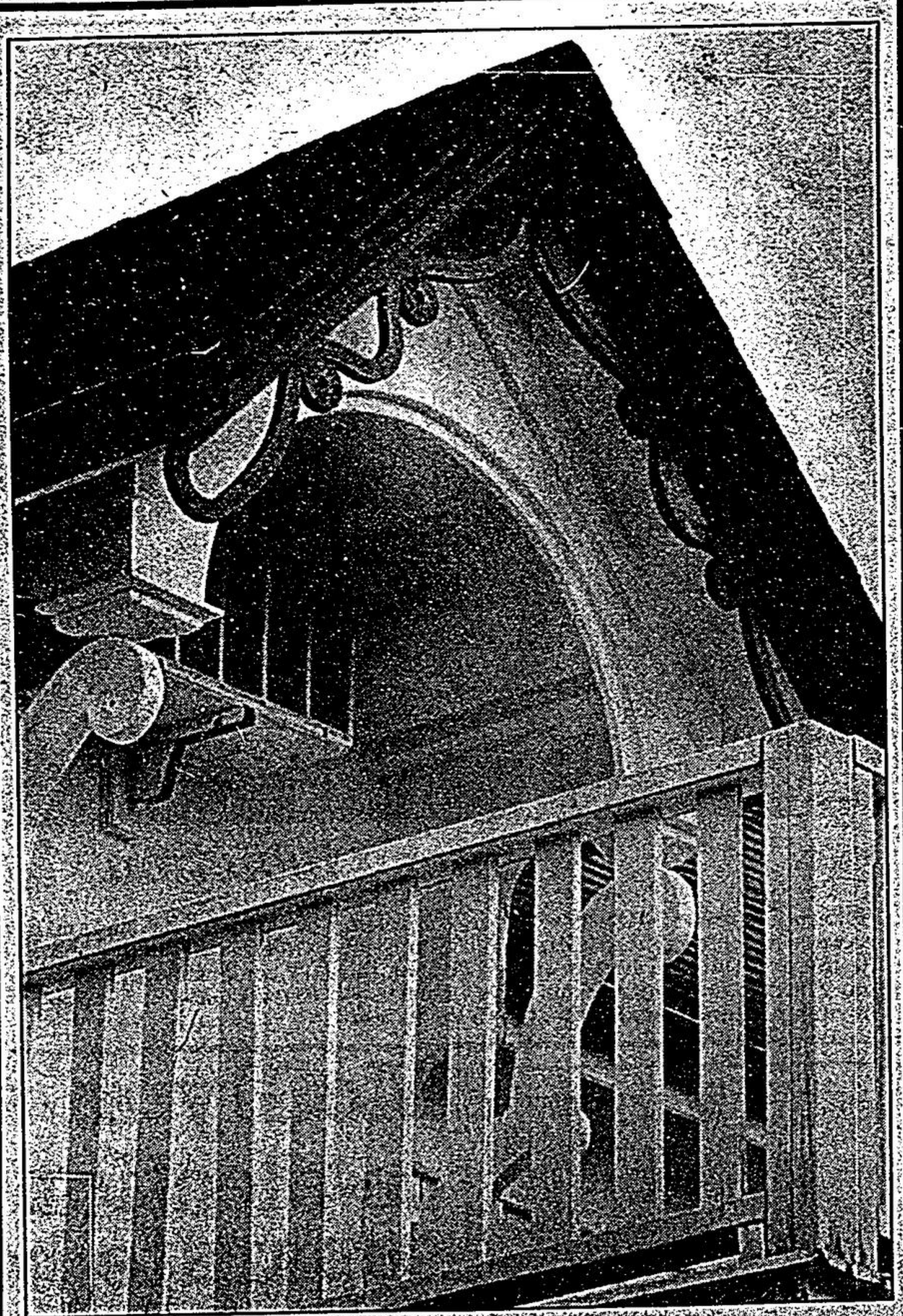

# Mediation continues in ambulance strike

Mediation will continue in hopes of ending the strike of ambulance workers in Stouffville, Uxbridge and other parts of the province.

A provincial mediator is overseeing negotiations between the Ontario Public Service Employees' Union (OPSEU) and the operators of privately-owned but provincially-funded ambulance services.

Pat Rooney, an OPSEU staff representative, said some progress was made during bargaining over the past week.

"I would say it's possible that a settlement is near," he told The Weekender. A date for the resumption of talks was not available at press time.

The union is representing the nine full-time and six part-time Stouffville-Uxbridge workers in their demands of wage and benefit parity with ambulance attendants employed directly by the Ministry of Health.

Ambulance drivers in Welland, Fort Erie and Port Colborne walked off the job 10 days after members of the Hamilton-Wentworth unit struck. Their Stouffville-Uxbridge counterparts followed on Aug. 19.

The Hamilton-Wentworth employees are delaying their ratification vote on a tentative settlement to put pressure on the negotiators.

The striking workers here earn \$10.50 an hour compared to \$11.78 an hour by Ministry drivers.

## Local PCs send ten to convention

The York Centre P.C. Association will hold a special meeting on Tuesday, Oct. 1 to select delegates to attend the P.C. Leadership Convention Nov. 15 and 16.

Randy Barber, President of the Association, said, "We will hold our annual meeting on the same night to review our achievements for 1984-85 and to elect officers to the 1985-86 executive."
