Pregnancy Centre closes

MARKHAM — Markham's Pregnancy Crisis Centre has been closed indefinitely. Board Chairman Bill McNalley told The Tribune the Centre was closed because a new centre in North Toronto takes many calls originally referred to Markham and due to a lack of funding.

"Many girls found it difficult to come all the way up to Markham during their crisis," he said. "We were taking a lot of calls but when the new centre opened at Yonge and Finch, girls found it easier to go there."

He pointed out that calls the Markham Centre now receives are referred to the North Toronto centre.

The purpose of a pregnancy crisis centre is to offer counselling, assistance and places to stay for girls and women who find themselves "in trouble".

The Markham Centre closed down after less than a year's operation. Mr. McNalley emphasized that at this point, the closing is still temporary.

"We're not disbanding as such. If the board deems there's a need, we will definitely re-open," he said.
