Recycling Week Get in the habit

STOUFFVILLE — The Minister of the Environment, The Hon. Jim Bradley, has proclaimed Sept. 30 to Oct. 5 'Recycling Week in Ontario'. Whitchurch-Stouffville is so enthused by the proclamation, it will begin celebrations two days early.

On Sat., Sept. 28 at 9 a.m., Mayor Tom Wood will cut the ribbon to officially open a special recycling depot at the old arena, Park Street South. The depot will be placed under a large, brightly colored marquee, decorated with bunting.

Following the opening, there will be honorary presentations to recognize individuals and organizations who have been important to the recycling project in Town.

Donna Brown, President of the non-profit Recycling Group, says it's easy for everyone to participate in Recycling Week merely by taking a few minutes each day, to separate recyclables from their garbage. Newspapers, corrugated cardboard, glass containers, tin cans and clean film plastic (such as grocery bags), can all be brought to the depot.

On the two Saturdays at the beginning and end of Recycling Week, balloons and buttons will be presented to children, (and others), who visit the depot.

Mayor Wood says he's pleased to officially open Recycling Week in Whitchurch-Stouffville. Current estimates suggest increased garbage disposal costs will add \$35 to the average property tax bill—40 percent more than for the new Rec. Centre.

"It looks like garbage disposal costs will continue to rise in coming years," he said.

Evelyn Rae, treasurer for the Recycling Group, reports \$6,625 raised for various community groups and projects during the past year. All the money has come from the sale of recyclables that otherwise would have been dumped.

The special Recycling Week depot will be open daily from Sept. 28 to Oct. 5, (except Sunday), from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The regular depot, at the Public Works Yard on Burkholder Street, will be closed during this period, but will be open for business as usual on Thursdays from 10 a.m. until noon and Saturdays from 9 a.m. until noon, following Recycling Week.

Library Amnesty Week

Sept. 23 to Sept. 29 is Amnesty Week at the Town Library.

During this period, all overdue materials may be returned without penalty.

They may be left at the front desk, (no questions asked), or deposited in the outdoor chute at the Library entrance.
