A kindergarten teacher 34 years at Agincourt Public School, Jessie earned the love and respect of children and parents alike.

She retired in 1973.

Jessie was born on a farm at the north-east corner of Sheppard Avenue and Brimley Road in Scarborough. Following graduation from Normal School, she taught at Fox Grove in Markham Township before joining the staff at Agincourt.

Even after retirement, she continued her association with the school. She enjoyed telling the history of the Agincourt community, as she remembered it in her youth. Seldom did she miss a graduation ceremony involving her former pupils.

She was a long-standing member and an elder in the congregation of Knox Presbyterian Church, Agincourt.
