It seems rather strange to us that at a time when York Region is growing so rapidly, that the health branch is forced to layoff employees because of the shortfall in provincial government grants.


While the shortfall is apparently a misunderstanding of York's true population by provincial officials, it is disturbing that York Region would be so quick to announce layoffs.
