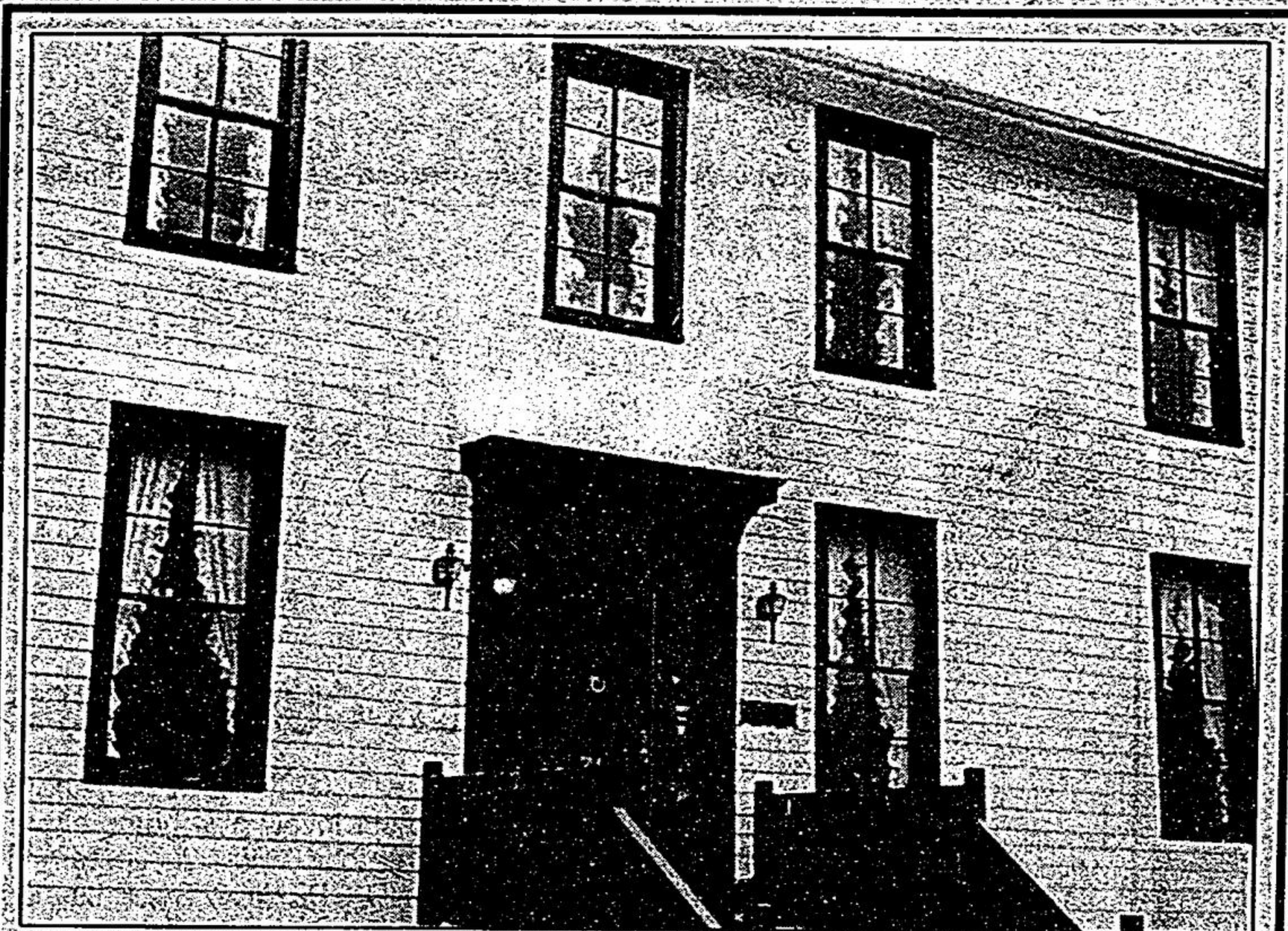

## Mallon seeks re-election to Separate School Board

Noting that the next few years in Catholic education are going to be extremely challenging, Trustee June Mallon announced she will seek re-election on the separate school board in Wards 3 and 6.

Mrs. Mallon has been a trustee in the Town of Markham for 11 years. She has chaired and served on numerous committees, including education, management, negotiations and special education.

With a 16.8 per cent increase in the number of students this year, Mrs. Mallon believes her experience as a trustee in rapidly ex-

panding areas will be a great benefit to parents and the school board.

"The next few years in Catholic education are going to be extremely challenging and will demand much of a trustee," said Mrs. Mallon. "Because I do not work I am able to give most of my time and energy to board and school activities and I am readily accessible to all separate school supporters."

Mrs. Mallon's top concerns for the upcoming year include:

- Continued provision of sound academic curriculum that reflects Catholic values and principles.

- On-going liaison with local officials and the Ministry of Education to ensure funds for new schools in Unionville.

- Further expansion of special education services including a program for the gifted.

- Wise and fiscally responsible planning for the present and future rapid growth of the school system.

- Improvement of parent-trustee-board communications.

Mrs. Mallon has been a resident of the Town of Markham since 1962 and has six children, all graduates of separate schools.

At the Oct. 10 meeting of the Township's finance and property committee, mayor Bill Ballinger and Ward 4 councillor Sandy Ewen both said they don't feel the structure has any historic significance.

A motion was then carried officially stating that, at this time, the municipality has no intention of assuming or purchasing the hall.

Uxbridge resident Don Hendry, acting on behalf of a group of fellow concerned citizens, requested that Council acquire the building and have it restored as a tourist attraction.
