Bill Burnett seeks third term at hydro

Incumbent Bill Burnett will seek his third term on Markham Hydro Commission on a platform of maintaining present rates and availability.

Mr. Burnett is a 14-year resident of Markham who has served as vice-chairman of the commission. He promotes energy conservation and plans for future development.

He said, "Your hydro bill and mine used to be an incidental household cost. Today, we have to take a serious look to keeping these costs as low as we can while

still providing the best possible service."

His community activities include membership on the Markham Fair Board and in Unionville Alliance Church, volunteer instructor for St. John Ambulance, past president of Markham Minor Hockey Association, past chairman of Finland Hockey Exchange and past supervisor of Thornlea Continuing Education Program.

Mr. Burnett is technical director of Unionville High School. He and his wife Jo-Anne have three children, Derek, Stephanie and Andrea.

McNabb relies on his vast experience

Having served 19 years as a hydro commissioner, Don McNabb feels he has the experience to continue.

Mr. McNabb, recently retired and intends to devote even more time than he has in the past to addressing the concerns of residents about Markham Hydro Commission.

His involvement with public utilities began 35 years ago when he started working for one of the metro electrical utilities. Before the Markham Hydro Commission was formed, he worked as commissioner of the Public Utilities

Commission.

When the time came to set up a municipal hydro system, Mr. McNabb was on hand to explain its advantages to residents.

The long-time Markham resident has been involved in a number of community boards including, the Markham Arena Board, Thornhill Arena Advisory Committee, Boy Scouts Group Committee and the Markham Centennial Advisory Committee.

He was also appointed vice-chairman of a regional study team to examine hydro systems in York Region.

Mr. Harrison and his family have lived 13 years in the Markham area — six of those in Unionville.

He is a graduate of the urban studies program at York University with 18 years experience in media and planning. He is also active in many community activities.

Mr. Harrison is one of eight candidates vying for four positions on the Markham Hydro Commission.

Cockburn concerned over rising costs

Don Cockburn is seeking reelection to the Markham Hydro Commission on the basis of his past experience and concern about the cost of hydro electricity.

Mr. Cockburn has served three terms on the commission in positions of chairman, vice-chairman and member of the audit committee. As the owner of an electrically heated home, he is concerned with rates and reliability.

He feels the commission must embark on a load management program, seeking consumer cooperation to reduce future rate increases.

Mr. Cockburn has represented

the commission in negotiations with Ontario Hydro, the Ministry of Energy, Environmental Hearing Board and other government departments and agencies.

The Thornhill resident is president of a private investment firm and retired partner of a consulting engineering company.

His past involvement in the community includes; director of the Unionville Home Society, life member of the Lions Club, past chairman of both United Way and the Thornhill Community Centre Board and former director of York Region branch of the Red Cross Society.
