On Nov. 13, all students of Stouffville Dist. Secondary School viewed a movie entitled "Don't Let It Be You."

It was brought to S.D.S.S. by the group Toc Alpha.

THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF an application by The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville for approval to expropriate easements on, over, under, and through land being parts of Lot 35, Concession 8, shown as Parts 17, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 on Reference Plan 65R-7909 in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, in the Regional Municipality of York, for the purpose of:

The accommodation of water and sewer services in, and access for the purposes of the installation and maintenance of the said services to, Parts 19, 20, 25, 26 and 27 on Plan 65R-7909, for all of which a permanent easement is required; and access for the purpose of the installation of the said services to Parts 17, 18, 24 and 28 on Plan 65R-7909, for which a temporary easement is required.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate easements on, over, under, and through the land described as follows:

TEMPORARY EASEMENTS on, over, under, and through all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, in the Regional Municipality of York, and being composed of Part of Lot 35 in the 8th Concession of the said Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, shown as Parts 17, 18, 24 and 28 on reference Plan 65R-7909.

PERMANENT EASEMENTS on, over, under, and through all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, in the Regional Municipality of York, and being composed of Part of Lot 35 in the 8th Concession of the said Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, shown as Parts 19, 20, 25, 26 and 27, on Reference Plan 65R-7909.

Any owner of land in respect of which notice is given who desires any inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing:

- (a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail, within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that:
  - (a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Attorney General;
  - (b) the inquiry officer,
    - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
    - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.
2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows: "owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested; "registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper land registry or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.
3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notified the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
