

Markham company gives art award

For the second year in a row, Bainbridge Canada Ltd. of Markham has donated the award for the best work entered in the Colour and Form Society's 33rd annual open juried art exhibition currently showing in Toronto.

Bainbridge, which produces the matboards used in framing, is one of a group of three companies that produce art and framing materials. The company decided last year to support this art show because it is "trying to get more of

an appreciation factor of good matting in framing," said Mr. Perry Conty, the company's advertising manager.

The winner of the first award, Stephenie Rayner of Toronto, was at the show's opening on November 9 to accept the \$150 award from Bainbridge for her paper sculpture entitled "Sleeping Dragon."

Ms. Rayner said she had never before taken her paper sculpture works to a show since she considers herself primarily a printmak-

er. Her fascination with the printmaking process stems from her "love of paper — the way ink sits on paper, the translucence of the colour of paper," she said. Over the past 10 years her prints have become more textural and sculptural.

Rather than take formal art lessons, "I lived art school," Ms. Rayner explained. Her father

Gordon Rayner and her brother Gordon Rayner Jr. are among the seven generations of artists that had their roots in England.

This art show has, over the years, given many younger artists an opportunity to exhibit their works in a professional setting. The society offers a the public a chance to view the work of the Society's members, who are established Ontario artists.

The Colour and Form Society sponsored the show's other two awards. This lively art exhibition continues till November 29 in the Upper Gallery of Northern District Library, 40 Orchard View Blvd. in Toronto (near Yonge St. and Eglinton Ave.)

This is the ninth year that the Society has had an art show in this location.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

and your 1986 Municipal and School Taxes

Regional Offices located throughout Ontario are responsible for assessing all real property for the purposes of municipal and school taxation.

The resulting Assessment Rolls are delivered to municipalities which use them to set their mill rates and compute municipal property tax bills.

The amount of property tax you pay on your home or business depends on the assessed value and the mill rate set by your municipality. The assessed value multiplied by the mill rate will determine your 1986 property taxes.

Open House Sessions

Open Houses are your opportunity to fully understand your assessment and to evaluate its equity.

Open Houses are held in every municipality at convenient times and locations, to provide you with the opportunity to discuss your assessment with staff of the Regional Assessment Office.

An assessor will be pleased to explain the basis of your property assessment and is authorized to amend any information as may be necessary prior to the delivery of the Assessment Roll to your municipality.

If you have any questions but are unable to attend the Open House, please contact your Regional Assessment Office at the address or telephone number shown below.

Assessment Notice

Property owners and tenants will receive an Assessment Notice *only if information regarding their property or assessment was changed during the past year, if the assessment was appealed last year, or if the property has been reassessed under section 63 of the Assessment Act.* If you receive an Assessment Notice, it may reflect changes you have requested in your school support designation, in the amount

of your assessed value, or other recorded information on last year's Notice.

Appeal Procedure

If, after attending your local Open House, you are still dissatisfied with your assessment, you have a right to appeal it to the Assessment Review Board. The Assessment Review Board conducts informal hearings and is responsible for determining whether the assessment under appeal is fair and equitable with the assessments of similar properties in the vicinity or neighbourhood, and may alter your assessment accordingly.

Appeal Deadline

The final date for appealing your assessment is January 7, 1986.

Your appeal must be forwarded, either on a Notice of Appeal Form or as a letter, to the Regional Registrar of the Assessment Review Board on or before January 7, 1986, noting your property address, Roll Number and the reason for the appeal.

To assist you in this regard, Notice of Appeal forms and the address of the Regional Registrar of the Assessment Review Board are available at Open Houses, your Regional Assessment Office, or your municipal office.
