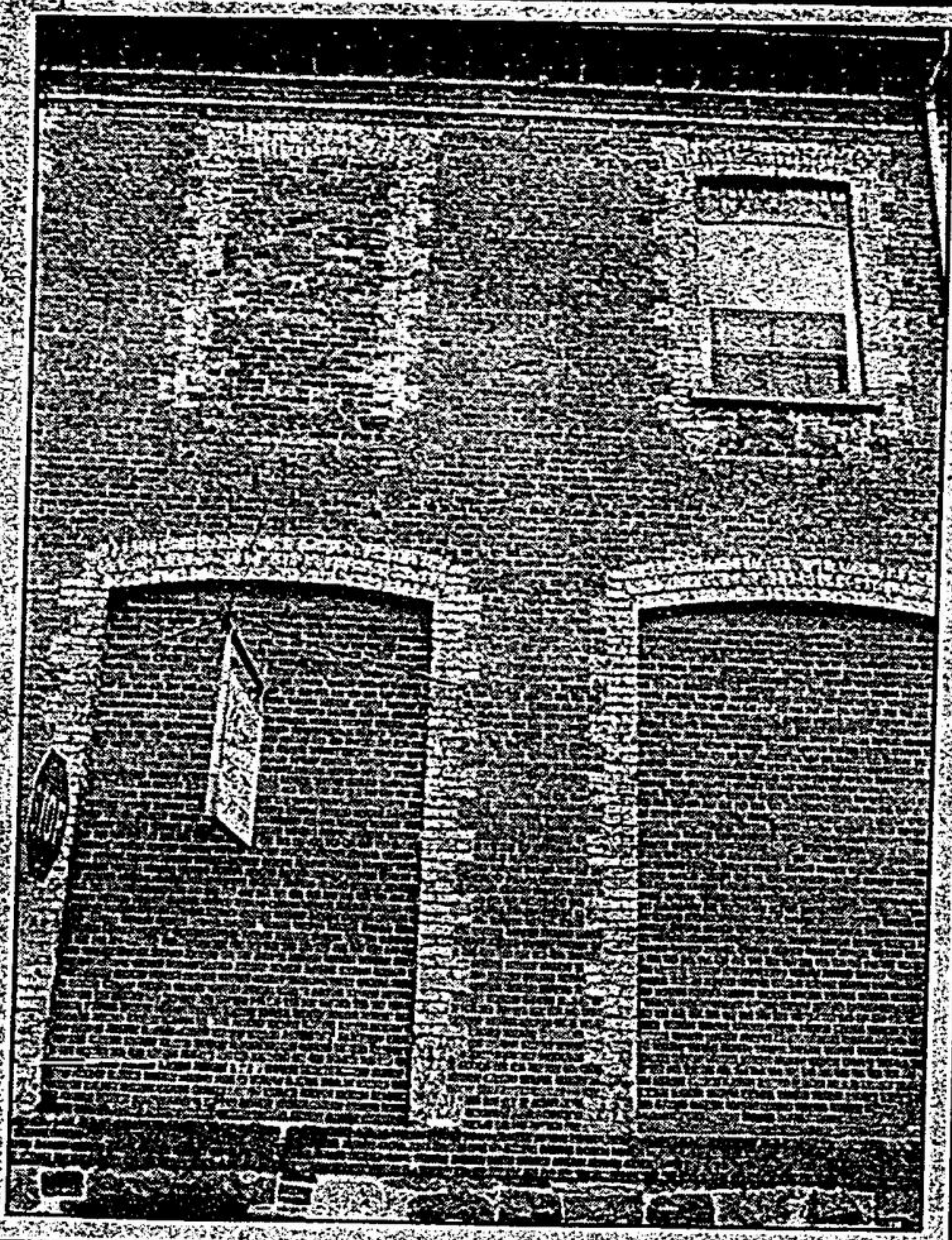


Name That Building

Festive spirit at area libraries

Those who still have time to spare during the busy holiday season can find many things to do at the libraries in Markham and Unionville.

Two films will be screened Thursday, Dec. 12 at 2 p.m. during the seniors social time at the Markham Community Library. The Olden Days Coat is a movie based on the book by Canadian author Margaret Laurence. Also being shown is The First Christmas Snow. There is no admission charge and refreshments will be served.

On Saturday, Dec. 14 children ages six to 12 are invited to join Janet Bingham for a trip back in time to a pioneer Christmas.

Young people who intend to earn money babysitting might consider taking a babysitting course beginning in January. Registration for classes began at 9 a.m. today.

There is a fee of \$6.50 and registrants must be 12 years old by the end of the course. Graduates of the program receive a certificate from the Ontario Safety League.

There will be three classes offered, Tuesdays from 7 to 8:30 p.m. beginning Jan. 14, Wednes-

days from 4:30 to 6 p.m. beginning Jan. 15 and Thursdays from 7 to 8:30 p.m. beginning Jan. 16.

Children are invited to register in advance for a Christmas tree decoration workshop at Unionville Library.

On Saturday, Dec. 14 at 10:30 a.m. children ages seven and up can help trim the library Christmas tree and take home a tree decoration.

Registration for a number of children's programs begins Tuesday, Dec. 10 at 2 p.m.

Included are Preschool French Activity Hour, Toddler Time, Story Time and Tales for Twos. Some courses are for adult and child while others are just for children. The fee for French, activity and toddler classes ranges from \$20 to \$25. There is no charge for story time or tales for twos.

Markham composer featured

In its gala opening concert, the National Chamber Orchestra of Canada will perform three pieces by Wesley Octavius Forsyth, a composer born in Markham in 1859, and who studied music in Leipzig and Vienna.

Returning to Canada, Forsyth taught at the Toronto College of Music, the Canadian Academy of Music, and at Upper Canada College. In addition to his teaching duties, he acted as a music critic and composed songs, piano pieces and orchestral works.

This performance of Forsyth's music will take place in Crignan Hall at Princess Ave., North York, on Dec. 15, at 8 p.m. Also included in the program will be works by Beecroft, Pergolesi, Britten and Woolcott.
