

For little Peter Night of tears

On Saturday afternoon, John and Joan Hazlewood and family returned to their home at 307 North Street, Stouffville, after attending the Santa Claus Parade. They placed six-week-old Peter in his carriage for a nap. A short time later, they looked in on him and discovered he wasn't breathing. He was pronounced dead on arrival at York Central Hospital, Richmond Hill. In memory of little Peter, Andrea Grundy of Hawthorne Avenue, a friend of the family, has written the following poem. It reads:

There was a child who never grew,
Many things he never knew.
People spent a night in tears,
For all in the family, it may take years.

Six weeks old is not a life,
At least for him, no trouble and strife.
He didn't have his first teeth yet,
His first Christmas present, he'll never get.

I saw him up close this afternoon,
Not expecting tonight to feel such gloom.
His beautiful eyes twinkled in awe,
At all the beautiful things he saw.

Here this morning, gone tonight,
Why do our lives hold such fright?
The child was given, now he's taken,
At least we know he's now in heaven.

The family can't see it's for the best,

For up in heaven, they'll see Peter once more.

NOTICE OF HYDRO RATE INCREASE FOR 1986

On January 1st, 1986, Ontario Hydro will increase cost of power to municipal utilities by 4%. Part of this increase will offset increased water rental charges levied by the Provincial government, and part will be used to subsidize Ontario Hydro rural residential rates.

For these reasons, as well as additional capital costs required in the continuous upgrading and expansion of service, including water heater rentals, and other operating expenditures beneficial to the sound financial position of the Utility, all customer bills, effective February 1, 1986, will reflect a proposed average rate increase for power used on and after January 1, 1986 of 4%.

Upon receipt of approval from Ontario Hydro, a detailed schedule of rates will be published, and all customers will receive a copy of the new rates enclosed in their billing.

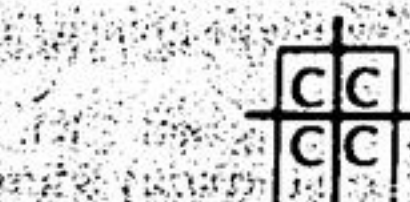

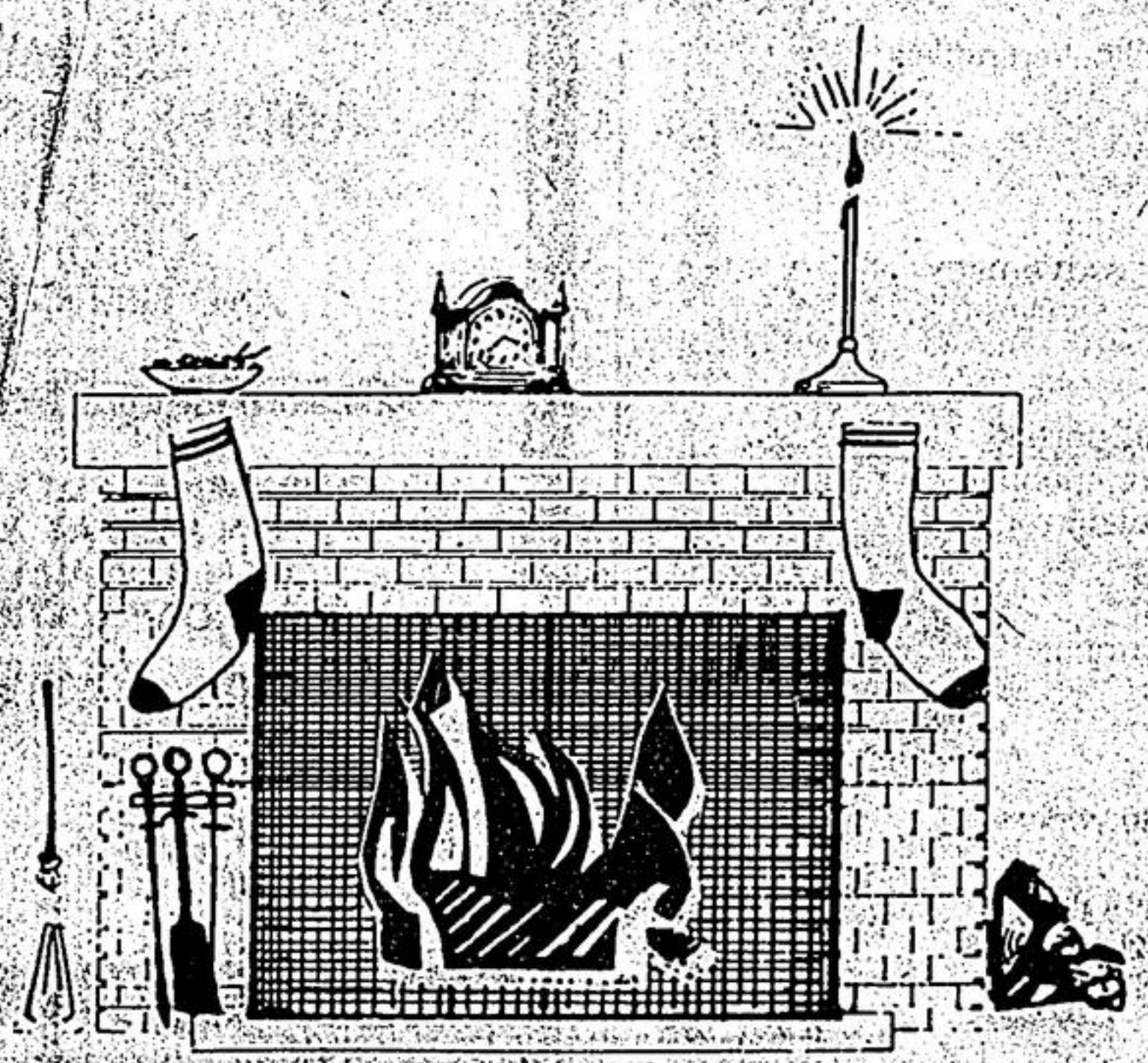

Keep Fire



In Its Place at Christmas

CHRISTMAS SEASON BRINGS THREATS TO CHILD SAFETY

"Christmas brings temptations to many parents, while visiting with neighbours or completing last minute shopping, to leave small children unattended for short periods," says Fire Chief.

"At the same time, decorations, trees and wrapping paper bring an increased threat of fire danger unless constant care is exercised."

The Fire Chief urges all parents to recognize the fire danger of this season, and not to leave small children alone in the home for a moment. He points out that the Criminal Code of Canada forbids such action which endangers the life or health of any child under the age of ten years.

Parents are further reminded that under certain conditions a Christmas tree can be ignited by a single match to burn furiously to charred wood in a few seconds. Care must be taken to keep butts of natural trees immersed in water and to ensure that the tree itself does not obstruct access to a door or window. Families are also urged to review their home fire-escape plans.
