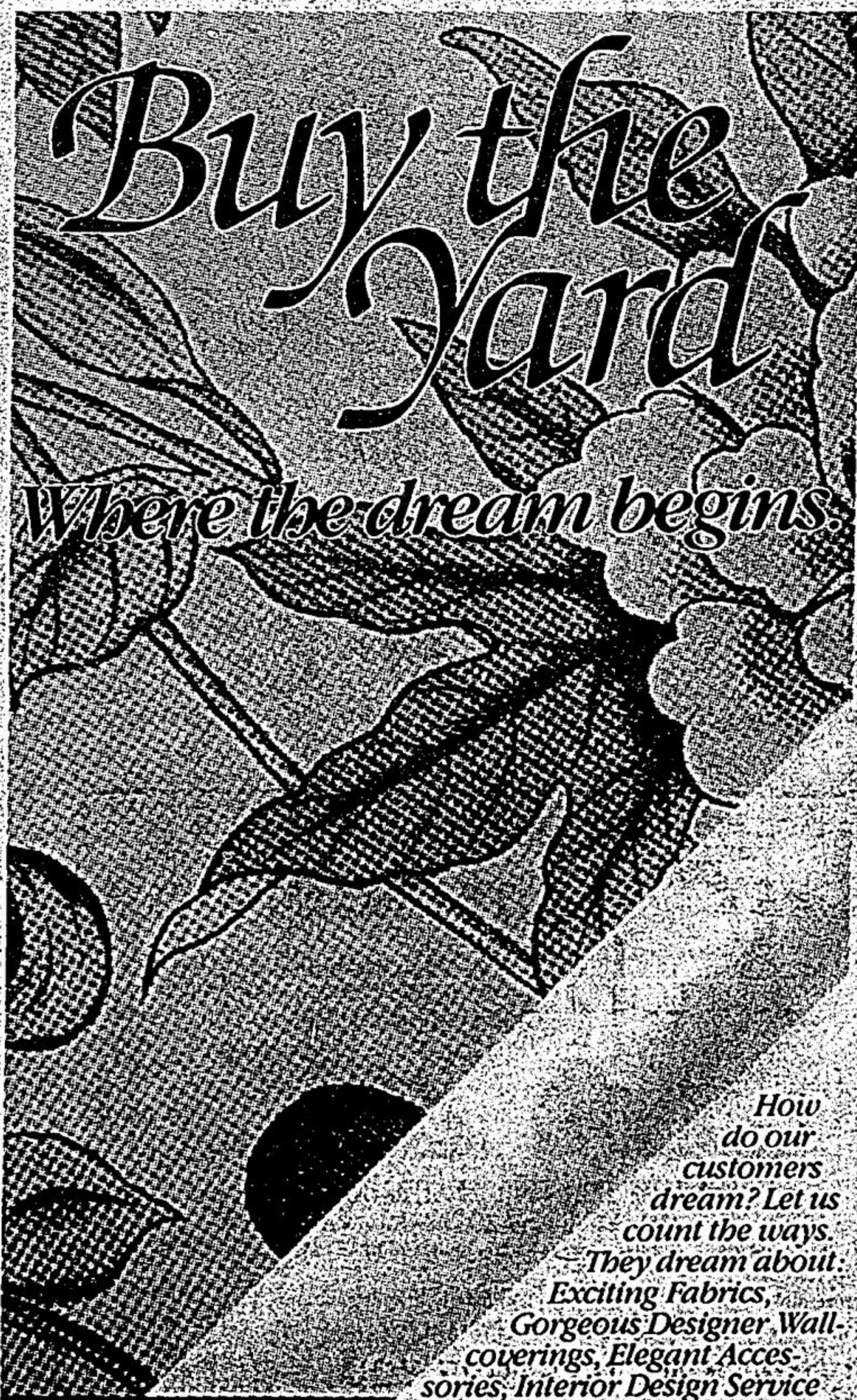

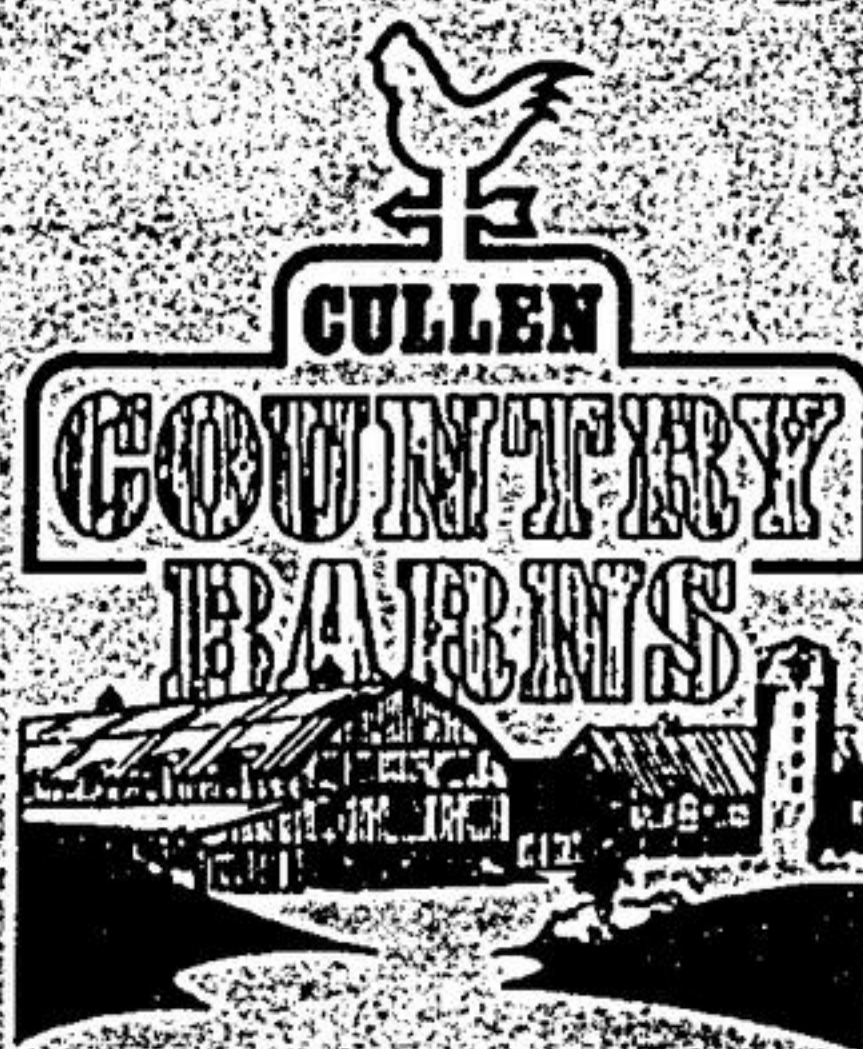

Green and Growing

Colorful plants can brighten

Grey skies are brightened and decorative accent is ours with the welcome colors from exquisite flowers adorning holiday plants.

The traditional favorite, Poinsettias (Christmas Star), are advantageously displayed when several are massed together in a low position. This grouping lets them share each other's humidity, too.

Let the soil surface dry before a thorough watering with tepid water. Give very bright light. Keep out of drafts and away from heat sources like floor registers, fireplaces and atop radiators, etc.

The festive bracts of this native of Mexico will keep longer if kept in a room that is not overheated. (The bracts surround the actual insignificant yellow flower in the centre.) Don't worry if a few leaves drop after moving in with you — this is normal. And, when flowering is completed, it can serve as a nice foliage plant.

The easy-to-grow Christmas Cactus is my favorite. In my eyes, the color splashes from drooping flowers at the tips of pendulous stems are set off splendidly in a hanging basket, especially in a mature specimen.

This beauty is not a desert cactus, but a succulent, and the soil should never be allowed to dry out. Give evenly moist soil, bright light out of direct sun and moderate humidity. It is easy to get along with because it's comfortable in normal room temperatures and is rarely bothered by insects.

With proper care, this one can easily share our homes and achieve quite a size over the years. In summer, place the plant farther back from a sunny window so leaves aren't sunburned.

Newly-formed buds may drop if the direction of light is changed. I learned from experience that even a quarter turn of the container could result in some disappointing bud loss. (A Hoya or Wax Flower will drop its buds for the same reason, too.)

HELPFUL HINTS:

So very many plants are growing in an artificial mix — this is light in weight and upon drying will shrink. When watering, check to ensure the mix hasn't shrunk from container sides as the moisture will only run down the sides and out the bottom — completely bypassing thirsty roots. Thoroughly soak the pot with tepid water to expand the mix and discard excess water in the saucer afterwards.
