Registration is taking place this week to Jan. 10. Daytime and evening classes are available at the Recreation Complex, Ninth Line North.

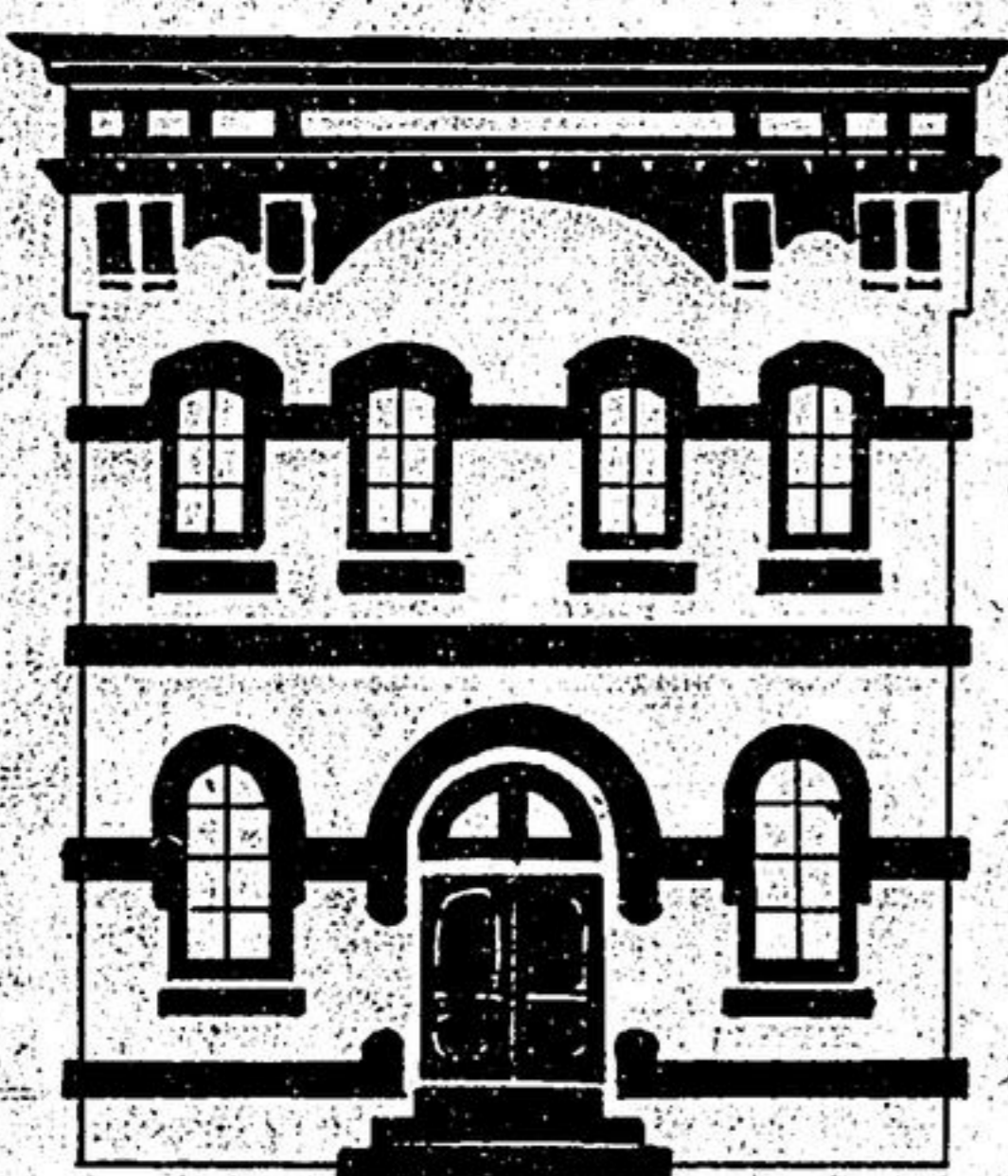
