Senior girls win Mississauga Championship

Stouffville Stinger backcatcher, Jannine Ferguson, proved she's not only a great wild-pitch snagger, but a shrewd puck stopper.

Ferguson who plays for the Betz Pools senior girls hockey team—usually policing the; blue line—found herself in an odd role that helped her team win the annual Mississauga Senior "D" Championship two weekends ago.

LAST MINUTE CHANGE
When the seniors' regular goalie was unable to attend the tourney at the last minute, Ferguson played savior and strapped on the pads.

With only seven players to back her up, the makeshift netminder allowed only nine goals in five

games. Defenceman Denise Coppins kept opposing sharpshooters at bay with a tremendous blue line patrol effort.

The team went on to win five consecutive games—the last one for the Championship.

Stouffville upended Oakville 9-2 in the opener. Debbie Coxworth scored five goals. Singles went to Leslie Eakins, Karen Brodie (player-coach), Allison Jacket and Barb Goudie.

Scarborough was felled 4-2 in game two. Eakins scored a pair of markers, and Coxworth and Goudie rounded out the tally.

TOUGH OPPONENT
Stouffville met Allan Park (Michigan) for game three in what eventually ended up the first of

two confrontations. The local girls trailed the Michigan squad by two goals before responding with three unanswered markers to secure a 3-2 comeback win.

Coxworth had another exceptional game. She blasted a pair of goals while Jacket slapped home a single.

Stouffville razed the host Mississauga club 6-2 in the semifinal. Coxworth, Brodie, Eakins, Goudie, Jacket and Gloria Mintz did the damage.

Allan Park, again, gave the local seniors a tough time early in the Championship game. The American team took a 1-0 lead before Stouffville fought back to score four unanswered goals and clinch the crown.

Goudie slipped home a pair while Coxworth notched her 10th goal of the tournament; coupled with five assists; she accumulated a 15-point weekend. Eakins rounded out the tally.
