

How high is up?

STOUFFVILLE — House prices will increase in the year ahead by as much as 10 to 15 per cent according to Gerry Meharg of Gerry Meharg Real Estate Limited, Stouffville.

In 1985, property values here went up about 11 per cent with the greatest escalation coming in the last two months. In an interview Friday, Mr. Meharg said he expects the trend to continue.

Mr. Meharg explained that at present he has 72 clients looking for homes in town and that "new houses are being absorbed (bought up) very quickly."

Prices in the area now range from \$90,000 to \$140,000, Mr. Meharg said.

But he warns, "what goes up, must come down." In his 20 years working with real estate, he recalls six similar trends in the market and every time prices dropped after a fast climb.

To illustrate the demand for housing in Stouffville, Mr. Meharg said "there are about 400 applications on file for the 125 units (expected to become available in the spring) at Parkview Village."

Mr. Meharg says a major hindrance to construction is the town's lack of sewage facilities. One solution, he said, would be to hook up to the York-Durham system commonly referred to as "The Big Pipe," but that would be very expensive.

He also expressed concerns about the kind of rapid growth such a move would permit.

He said local residents might not want expansion similar to what Markham has experienced.

With the expansion of water and sewage services to the west end of town, Mr. Meharg said he expects some industrial development to take place in that area, but it will be limited on scope he believes.

French course popular

CLAREMONT — A French Immersion program is underway in the Region of Durham and growing rapidly, says Board of Education trustee Lyn Craig.

It begins in Kindergarten and extends through Grade 3. Mrs. Craig explained, "Many of the Region's gifted children are included."

A number of locations have been established and the pupils are bused there from various communities. A half-time teacher has been hired.

While the program has created some problems and generated some complaints, Mrs. Craig feels that, for the most part, it's working well.

All children are exposed to French instruction from Grades 4 to 8.

"The more languages and the more cultures we know, the better we'll be able to get along," Mrs. Craig says.

The idea of French Immersion pupils entering Grade 4 where the subject is at an introductory stage, can't work, the Claremont area trustee said. "It's too much of a mish-mash," she concluded.

Good response for Clinic

STOUFFVILLE — Friday's Blood Donor Clinic at the Legion Hall collected 40 per cent more than anticipated, according to Mrs. Walter Smith, a chief organizer.

Mrs. Smith described the Clinic as "one of the best ever."

The 154 units collected was well over the target of 110.
