Top honor for MAC swimmer

Laurie Demorest has become the first-ever Town of Markham Aquatic Club (MAC) swimmer to earn a national championship.

The 13-year-old club veteran swam to a gold-medal finish at the National Youth Championships in Etobicoke last weekend. The win means she's automatically a member of the national youth team.

She's also qualified for the upcoming Senior National Championships, and the Commonwealth Games trials.

DeMorest twice set new MAC standards in the event. She smashed the old time in the preliminary heats, then recorded a time of 1:05.87 in the final. That broke her new record pace by two seconds.

MAC Coach Bernie Bredschneider was delighted with the performance. He credited DeMorest's long course (50-m. pool) training in Florida over the holidays as a reason for her success.

DeMorest also finished a close second in the 200-m. butterfly, missing a gold medal by 22/100ths of a second. Her pace in this and the 400-m. individual medley (where she placed seventh) established two more new club records.

Julie Klein also represented MAC at the competition, earning a sixth and a seventh and breaking two five-year-old club records.

As well, Klein won the consolation final of the 200-m. freestyle with yet another new MAC time.

The boys were led by Unionville's Gannon Jones. He broke a five-year-old club record by six seconds en route to a third in the 200-m. backstroke consolation final.

Jones also set a new MAC time in the 100-m. backstroke, but just missed qualifying for the consolation final. Jason Allen had a club record-setting time in the 100-m. breaststroke.

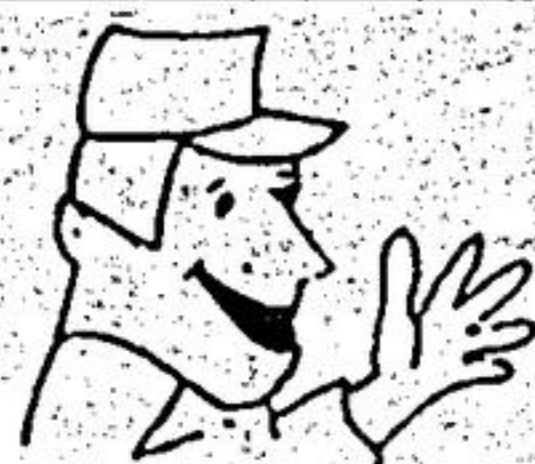
