

New restaurant oriented to sports

STOUFFVILLE — The Greens' is coming to Stouffville. This sports oriented family restaurant, formerly the Monte Cristo, will open in about a month at Success Square, Main and Stouffer Streets, Stouffville.

The co-owners are Ken May of Stouffville and Dave Wood of Agincourt. Mr. Wood is the former manager and pro at Sleepy Hollow Golf and Country Club. Major interior renovations are now under way with mid-

February the tentative completion date. Bob Bruce Construction of R.R. 3, Stouffville has the contract. "You won't recognize the place," Dave told The Tribune Monday, "it's exciting."

The environment sounds exciting too. Through the media of a satellite dish, major sporting events like the World Series, the Stanley Cup and the Grey Cup will be shown on a wide screen or a T.V. monitor.

Local games will be featured also. For example, a Bantam or Midget team will be able to sit down and watch a playoff contest played only a few hours before.

Ken May describes it as "a family restaurant oriented to sports." Both he and his partner are enthusiastic sports participants and spectators.

Ken and Dave stress the 'family' aspect of the operation. "Children will definitely be welcome; people of all ages will be made to feel comfortable," Ken said.

"We feel the town's ready for this kind of thing," said Dave. He describes the restaurant as "a neighborhood meeting place."

Live entertainment is being considered. Says Ken: "There'll be something going on all the time."

Ken says he's had this kind of operation in mind more than 15 years. "The Greens" will cater to all ages, he explains and all tastes. A businessmen's lunch will be featured Monday through

Friday with a full buffet on weekends. The staff will include as many local people as possible with 'service' a high priority. With respect to appearance, Ken says "you won't recognize the place." Accommodation will be increased from 138 to 240. The atmosphere will change with the occasion, the co-owners explained. Businessmen's meetings will be as much a part of the environment as the Blue Jays.

Ken and Dave said they could have geared their opening to the pre-Christmas season but reconsidered. "We wanted to wait and do it right," Dave concluded.
