Rev. Paul D. Scuse Anglican pastor

STOUFFVILLE — Rev. Paul Scuse, recently inducted priest at Stouffville's Christ (Anglican) Church, says he's looking forward to living outside Toronto.
 For the past five years, Rev. Scuse led a congregation in the Jane Street-St. Clair Avenue area. "The prospect of being out of the city seemed good to me and to my family. We're excited to enjoy a little open space."
 For wife Betty, it's like coming home. Much of her youth was spent in Markham, Paul explained. But Markham has changed so much since Betty lived there as a teenager. Now Stouffville reminds her of the town environment she once knew, her husband said.
 A broad smile crossed his face as he spoke appreciatively of the folks he'd already met within the parish. "The people have been very open and helpful during our moving-in process."
 But the move isn't over yet. "My first priority is to get out of the boxes and become settled," he said.
 During this rather traumatic experience, the children, Erin, 7; Jennifer, 6; and Jason, 4,

stayed with their grandparents until Thursday evening. On Friday, they'd already made a friend. "A child next door dropped by to greet the new kids on the block," he said.
 "We're excited to be here," Paul stated enthusiastically. "We hope to remain a good many years."
 Being the son of an Anglican priest, Paul has moved several times. Born in Peterborough, he went to live in Weston at age eight. At 18, his family moved to Agincourt. In 1975, he graduated from the University of Toronto with a Bachelor of Science degree. Four years later, he received a Master of Divinity degree from Wycliffe College. He was ordained a deacon in 1979 and a year later, a priest. From 1979 to 1981 he was assistant curate at Christ Church Oshawa after which, he became incumbent at the Church of the Advent, Toronto.
 Rev. Scuse says he may have to do some ad-libbing during the first several services until he discovers the needs and wants of the parish. "They have goals and so have I," he stated. "we can reach those goals by working together."
