 Kelly, 12, has been a Tribune carrier at Ballantrae since November, 1984. Jamie, 11, started one year later. Each has 36 customers plus Weekenders and flyers that go to every home. They are the family of Brian and Laura Sheridan, 40 Iroquois Drive.
 Kelly's route includes Iroquois Drive, Estyn Court, Carlsberg Court, Rosedale Court and Summit Place. Jamie's drops include Felcher Boulevard, High Point Drive, Jasmine Crescent, Redpines Court, Tamarac Street and Sunset Court.
 Kelly and Jamie deliver their Tribunes on Wednesdays after school and the Weekender Saturday mornings. When the weather's exceptionally cold, Mrs. Sheridan takes them by car. They ride their bikes spring, summer and fall.
 "My customers are nice," says Kelly. "every one knows me now."
 Jamie says the same. When Kelly retires, he plans to do his route and hers too.

Both have their own bank accounts. Kelly bought herself a 12-speed racer.
 Customer satisfaction is important. They knock at each door and hand the paper to the owner. If there's no one home and the door is locked, they place it under the mat.
 Doreen Deacon, The Tribune's Circulation Manager says she's never had a single complaint from subscribers on Kelly's or Jamie's routes. Both are friendly and polite.
 While these extra-curricular chores keep them busy, Kelly finds time to keep up with her studies in Grade 7 at Ballantrae School. She also enjoys swimming, reading, playing the organ and playing the clarinet in the school band. Art, Music and History are favorite subjects.
 Jamie enjoys most sports including soccer, swimming, hockey and softball. Math, English and Physical Education are favorite subjects. He's a student in Grade 5.

Insurance costs soar

STOUFFVILLE — Insurance premiums for the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville have increased more than 84 per cent since last year.
 Hank Roy of Frank Cowan Insurance, told the Finance and Administration Committee, at its last meeting, the premium this year is \$84,244, compared to \$45,875 in 1984. A further \$3,388 will be paid to cover any pollution damage suit.
 The new insurance coverage will pay up to \$7 million in liabilities, up \$2 million from a year ago. The pollution insurance will pay up to \$1 million, including the cost of clean-up.
 "There definitely is a problem," Mr Roy admitted.

Heart campaign-\$12,000 need more volunteers

"Follow your heart, give with your head" is the theme for this year's month-long Heart and Stroke Foundation Campaign that commenced Feb. 1.
 In a telephone interview, area chairperson Donna Mitchinson told The Tribune the target amount for donations is "to match 1985." Last year, the foundation received a record \$12,000 from the Whitechurch-Stouffville area, despite a shortage of volunteers in some districts. Mrs. Mitchinson said the average contribution must have been larger last year because fewer people were approached and a record high was reached.

However, to meet this year's goal, more volunteers are required. Mrs. Mitchinson said help is most needed in the Green Park, Westfield and Lakeview areas.
 Volunteers will go door-to-door, but residents in the outlying communities are asked to donate by mail. As well, pins and lapel roses will be sold "in all the strategic places around town, (medical and dental offices and drug stores)."
 Campaign literature and contribution forms were late in arriving, Mrs. Mitchinson said, causing some planning problems. Other years, these materials have been delivered by early January.

The committee has usually kicked off its campaign with a luncheon, but this year, she said, they haven't planned anything because of the delay in receiving materials. However, she's hoping to organize an afternoon coffee party with the 20 captains when they pick up their forms.
 The executive of the local Heart and Stroke Committee is made up of Councillor Jim Sanders (Publicity); Lavana Sanders (Public Education); Gail Richardson (Treasurer) and Donna Mitchinson (Chairperson). Gail Dunk the organization's Past-President has moved to the position of Area Co-ordinator for York Region.
