**STOUFFVILLE** — When 12-year-old Steven Campbell accompanies his Grade 7 classmates to Quebec City this spring, he'll pay his own way. Steven's a Tribune and Weekender carrier. He's been saving his money several months in anticipation of the trip.

It was two years ago last January he started his route, an area that includes part of Rupert Avenue and Glengall Lane. He has 30 Tribune subscribers. Forty-two homes also receive The Weekender, plus mid-week flyers.

He can cover the distance in about 45 minutes. Steven finds his two-wheeled cart a great help. He never has to reload.

Delivering his papers on time is as important to Steven as it is to his customers. He always makes sure each is tucked safely inside the front or side doors or in the door handles. He can't recall a single complaint except if he runs short. If for any reason he has to be away, Steven hires the services of friend Dean Petrie to give him a hand.

Are dogs a problem? Steven was asked. "There's one that growls," he replied, "but I'm not afraid. Most of my customers have cats."

Steven says the people on his route are very pleasant and generous, particularly at Christmas. "One lady gives me fifty cents extra every week," he noted.

Steven and his parents, John and Darlene Campbell of 96 Glengall Lane, are members in the congregation of Christ Church Anglican, Stouffville. He has three sisters, Sarah, 8; Lesley, 7 and Christine, 2 1/2 months.

Steven's other extra-curricular activities include building models, reading, running and playing baseball.

Twelve-year-old Steven Campbell, Glengall Lane, Stouffville, is one of the Tribune's most dependable carriers. His route includes part of Rupert Avenue and Glengall Lane. He delivers 30 Wednesday papers and 42 Weekenders and flyers.
