

Late Courtenay Clutterbuck

Talented writer, editor and painter will be missed at Parkview Home

STOUFFVILLE — Courtenay Clutterbuck, editor of Parkview Home's Newsletter, is dead at age 74. Heart failure was the cause. Rev. Ed Sparks, of Gormley Missionary Church, delivered the funeral service Saturday at Marshall Funeral Home, Richmond Hill.

For three years, Mr. Clutterbuck edited the newsletter every second month. Though he only wrote one page, the "Editor's Corner," it was his prompting that brought enough material to fill the paper, usually about 26 pages.

Several weeks before his death, Mr. Clutterbuck told The Tribune, in an interview, he only took the job of editor because the home asked him to. He said, "I couldn't say no. They had no one else to do

it," adding, he loves the job.

Besides the work involved with the newsletter, Mr. Clutterbuck kept busy doing oil paintings of landscapes and his favorite animals. He developed an interest in art after his son, Wayne, and daughter, Marie, gave him a gift of all the supplies.

His artistic talent, which he developed after moving to Parkview 15 years ago, has won numerous awards at Markham Fair. His right side was paralyzed forcing him to do his painting left-handed.

Many of his works are hanging on walls in the home's halls.

Mr. Clutterbuck's work has become popular around town. Several of his paintings were bought by local residents while other orders were not completed.

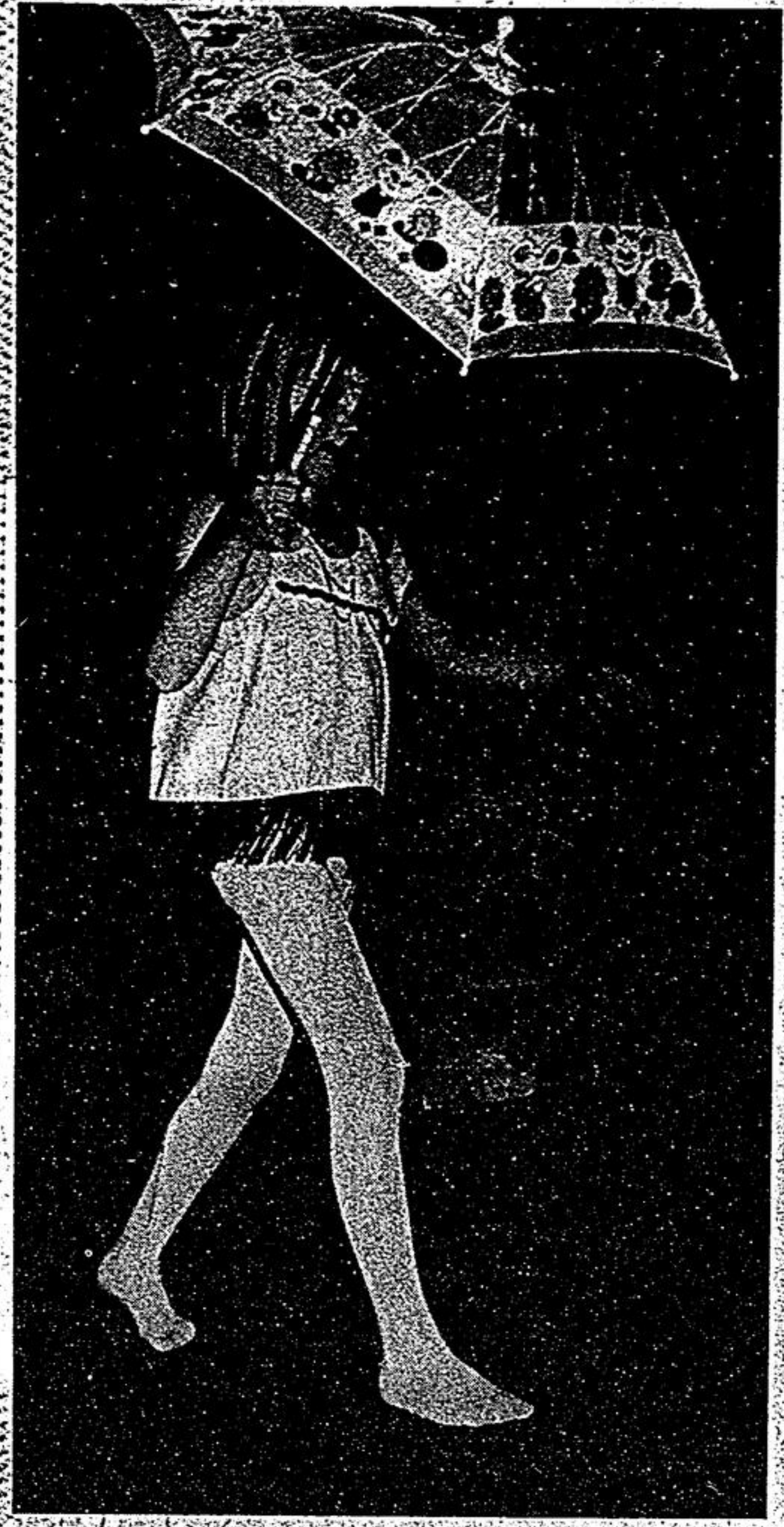
Another project he was busy

with resulted from a Christmas gift from Wayne and Marie. They gave him a binder, pen and abundant paper with the suggestion he should write his life story.

Shortly after the holiday, he began working on this project. In three months, he had written

memories from his sixth birthday to the age of 10.

A spring interment will be at Stouffville Cemetery. Mr. Clutterbuck will be missed by his many friends and family. He leaves behind daughters Diane, Marie, and son, Wayne.

Late Cecil Banks

Cabinet-maker loved his craft

STOUFFVILLE — Farmer, bee-keeper and cabinet-maker Cecil Banks died at age 74 after a lengthy bout with cancer.

Pastor Ed Sparks delivered a most appropriate message during the funeral service at the Gormley Missionary Church, March 3.

A spring interment will be at Dickson's Hill Cemetery.

In retirement, Mr. Banks realized his dream to travel. He and wife Blanche Gordon visited Hawaii, Alaska, British Columbia, Nova Scotia and, in 1985, they went to Great Britain.

Cecil was one of 12 children born to Fred and Luella Banks, Markham. The family lived on what is now the Otter farm.

In his early years, Mr. Banks farmed on the Ninth Concession, Stouffville, (now the Lehman farm) and Eighth Concession, Markham (near the Fairgrounds). He also worked with the Byer Brothers in their honey business.

In 1941, Mr. Banks married Vel-

ma Bolender of Whitchurch. They had no children of their own, but were foster parents to many.

For 35 years, Mr. Banks worked as a carpenter and cabinet-maker. He loved working with wood. During that time he also sidelined as a bee-keeper, an interest he developed while working with the Byer Brothers.

He built a house at Eagle Lake, near South River, in 1976. Two years later his first wife, Velma Bolender, died.

The following year, Mr. Banks married Blanche Gordon of Stouffville, and became step-father to Glendyne (Mrs. Otto Monreal) and Louise (Mrs. John Sargeant), all of whom respected him highly.

Cecil, a loving brother to Hazel, Vera, Clarence, Lorne, Violet, Howard, Omar and Doreen; was predeceased by siblings Percy and Mabel.

A devoted husband and staunch friend to many, Cecil Banks exemplified a Christian life.
